## Blue Jays Lean on Varsity Returners

With a number of varsity returners and a new schedule to work with, there's plenty of excitement heading into the football season at Washington High School.

The Blue Jays now play in the GAC Central Division with Ft. Zumwalt East, Ft. Zumwalt North, Ft. Zumwalt South and Holt.

With just four conference games to play in nine weeks, there's room for nonconference opponents, such as St. Clair, Timberland, Warrenton, Vianney and Howell North.

The new playoff format has Washington in Class 5 District 4 with Camdenton, Waynesville, Rolla, Lebanon and Smith-Cotton.

"We're excited about our schedule and our district. I think we match up better with these teams than the district we were in the last two years," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider.

"We have a lot of good teams on our schedule. We also have the ability to be a good team. We feel good about who we have, the talent we have and who we are."

Washington returns five offensive starters and five defensive starters from last season's team that went 3-7 overall, 2-3 in the GAC North and 1-2 in Class 5 District 5.

"We have a big senior class. Some of them have experience playing on Friday nights and some of them don't," Schneider said. "We have some experience at the skill positions. There are things to iron out on the line on both sides of the ball. We have a good group of kids."

Offensively, senior Luke Hasenjaeger returns for his third season as the Blue Jays' starting quarterback. Senior Justin Schuler is the backup quarterback.

Last season, Hasenjaeger threw for 2,013 yards with 15 touchdowns and 18 interceptions. He also rushed for 546 yards.

"Luke is going to have a good year," Schneider said. "He just has to play within himself and try not to do too much. He's a good leader."

Leading the way in the backfield are senior Randall Flotte and junior Kyle Summers, both varsity returners.

Flotte rushed for 629 yards last season. Summers rushed for 519 yards.

Junior Caleb Curran also will see time in the backfield.

"One of Randall's goals is to rush for 1,000 yards. He's very capable of doing that if he stays healthy," Schneider said. "Kyle is very solid. He's concentrating a lot on playing defense right now, but he's capable of big games in the backfield. Caleb is a kid who we have to find a way to get on the field. He's very fast, a lot like Randall."

Washington's top receivers, all seniors, are Brock Hopkins, Ben Gratza, Max Phinney and Derek Walters.

Hopkins had 45 receptions for 566 yards last season.

"If we can keep those receivers on the field and away from injury, we'll be pretty strong at that position," Schneider said.

The Blue Jays will start four seniors and one sophomore on the offensive line.

The sophomore is Nick Thiel, who will start at right tackle. The seniors are Brad Hellebusch at right guard, Dillon Bauer at center, Zachary Ray at left guard and Jared Walde at left tackle.

Seniors Ryan Glastetter and Zach Woosley and sophomore Brandon Brown also will see time on the offensive line.

"We're not real deep on the offensive line. We'll go seven or eight deep. It's nice to have four senior starters," Schneider said. "We have the potential to be very good upfront."

Schneider is confident the Blue Jays will be able to move the ball.

"Offensively, we'll run a no-huddle spread like we have in the past. We might show a two-back attack at times, which we haven't done in the past," Schneider said. "We can move the ball. We averaged over 350 yards per game last year. It's just a matter of limiting mistakes and finishing drives. We have to keep our turnovers down."

Defensively, the Blue Jays will again run a 3-4 scheme with three down linemen and four linebackers.

Starting on the line, all juniors, will be Kris Green at noseguard and Austin Subke and Nathan Kopp at the ends. Backups will be junior Jacob Kliethermes and Walde.

The starting outside linebackers figure to be junior D.J. Quaethem and Kyle Summers. Backups will be seniors Zach Pointer and Thomas McCain.

The starting inside linebackers will be senior Caleb Summers and junior Alex Schull. Backups will be senior Spencer Baird and sophomore Jacob Brinker.

In the secondary, starting at cornerback will be seniors Grant Aholt and Cody Summers. The backup is senior Jacob Arnold.

The starting safeties figure to be junior Michael Wadlow and Schuler. Senior Dilan Bollmann is the backup.

The kicker is senior Luke Hoemann. Phinney is the punter.

"We've had good practices. The kids are working hard and have good attitudes," Schneider said.

"We have to play with confidence and be able to put things together on both sides of the ball."

### St. Clair Outlasts Blue Jays In Game of Big Plays, 35-24

It was quite a way to kick off the high school football season. Playing in front of a large crowd Friday night at Washington High School, the Blue Jays slugged it out with St. Clair throughout the back-and-forth contest full of big plays.

The Bulldogs (1-0) emerged with a 35-24 victory over Washington.

"It's good to be 1-0. I thought across the board, we played pretty well," said St. Clair Head Coach Cody McDowell. "There are things that need to be cleaned up, but we'll get there. We're looking forward to week two."

The Blue Jays (0-1) had their chances.

"We were in position to be successful, but didn't finish the game," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "We played well for four 3 1/2 quarters. St. Clair played well for four quarters. That's what we're battling right now. We just have to learn to finish and win those kinds of games."

#### De Soto Preview

St. Clair, which plays four of its first five games of the season on the road, visits De Soto Friday at 7 p.m.

The Dragons (1-0) won their opener at home over Pacific, 26-13.

"De Soto has a physical team that likes to run the ball," McDowell said. "It's definitely a different animal than we faced last week. They don't spread the ball as much. Their offense is more ground and pound."

The Bulldogs will work this week on the strengths of the Dragons.

"It will be a different week of preparation compared to the Washington game," McDowell said.

"We have to play physical, fundamental football and limit our mistakes."

#### Timberland Preview

Washington hits the road Friday against Timberland at 7 p.m.

The Wolves (1-0) won their opener at Parkway West, 20-6.

"Timberland is a big team. They have good size on both the offensive and defensive line. They'll present problems for us trying to push them around," Schneider said. "I think we'll have some opportunities to do some things against their defense. We just have to execute better."

Schneider said Timberland runs a double tight, Wing-T offense.

"They run the ball a lot. They try to lull you to sleep with the run and then go over the top with the pass," Schneider said. "They want to control the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball with their size."

#### Play of the Game

With Washington holding a 24-21 lead, St. Clair's Rickey Grivetti turned the tide in the Bulldogs' favor when he intercepted a pass and ran 10 yards for a touchdown to give his team a 28-24 lead with 6:57 remaining in the fourth quarter.

"I saw the slant coming and I jumped on it. I don't know what happened after that. I just started running," Grivetti said. "We made a lot of big plays that were big enough to win the game." The Blue Jays got the ball back and threatened to regain the lead, but lost the ball on downs at the St. Clair eight-yard line with 3:19 left to play.

"Before the interception that went for a touchdown, we should have been able to put a drive together and run out the clock," Schneider said. "We definitely had our opportunities to win the game."

The Bulldogs put the game away on a 25-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kyle Juergens to Blake Dierking to increase the lead to 35-24 with 38 seconds remaining.

"I thought the pivotal moments of the game were not only Rickey's interception to give us the lead for good, but also when Kyle left the game for one series and Adam (Brott) took over at quarterback. He made a couple of nice runs and completed a pass," McDowell said. "We did a lot of good things on both sides of the ball."

### Big Plays

The two teams combined for four touchdowns that went for over 40 yards and three that went for over 70 yards.

"Both teams have talented offensive players who are hard to stop for four quarters," Schneider said. "With the exception of about three plays, I thought our defense did a good job."

St. Clair grabbed a 7-0 lead when quarterback Juergens tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to Rickey Grivetti with 11:40 left in the second quarter.

Washington came right back when Jacob Arnold took the ensuing kickoff 85 yards for a score to tie the game, 7-7.

The Bulldogs regained the lead with 7:23 left in the second quarter when Juergens dashed 73 yards for a touchdown to make the score 14-7.

The Blue Jays scored 10 points in the final 1:33 of the second quarter to take a 17-14 lead into intermission.

Luke Hoemann booted a 27-yard field goal followed by a two-yard touchdown pass from Luke Hasenjaeger to Brock Hopkins with nine seconds left on the clock to give the home team a 17-14 advantage.

Bulldogs' running back Adam Brott gave his team a 21-17 advantage on a 44-yard touchdown run with 7:29 left in the third quarter.

"We spread out our attack," McDowell said. "It was good to see everyone get involved."

Randall Flotte then broke loose for an 82-yard touchdown run to give the Blue Jays a 24-21 lead with three minutes left in the third quarter.

### Statistics

St. Clair accumulated 401 total yards, 231 rushing and 170 passing.

Juergens was 13-24 passing for 153 yards and two touchdowns. He also carried the ball 15 times for 150 yards and one touchdown.

"Kyle threw the ball better than he ever has," McDowell said. "He's a threat to make a big run whenever he touches the ball, but he's really been working hard on his throwing. His accuracy was spot on."

Adam Brott rushed for 60 yards on 11 attempts and scored one touchdown. He also had one catch for 12 yards and was 1-1 passing for 17 yards.

Grivetti rushed for 21 yards on seven attempts and had four receptions for 14 yards and one touchdown.

Dierking finished with six catches for 114 yards and one touchdown.

Evan Powell added two receptions for 24 yards. Alan Barrett had one catch for seven yards. Defensively for St. Clair, Grivetti led the way with five solo tackles, seven assists and one interception.

Josh Martin added four solos and eight assists. Ben Suntrup collected three solos and four assists. Barrett had three solos and three assists. Skyler Hutchison added two solos and six assists.

"With the exception of a couple of plays, our defense played really well," McDowell said. "Our defensive line and linebackers had a very good first game, especially with everything Washington does offensively."

Washington accumulated 314 total yards, 210 rushing and 104 passing.

Hasenjaeger was 11-23 passing for 104 yards with one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed for 54 yards on 13 attempts.

"We didn't throw the ball like we could have. Part of that was my play-calling," Schneider said.

"Luke was 8-13 in our base passing plays and 1-8 on throws where we were trying to attack certain parts of St. Clair's defense. We should have stuck to more of what we do. Luke will improve when we go back to doing things he's more comfortable with."

Flotte carried the ball 19 times for 159 yards and one touchdown. He also had two catches for 12 yards.

Hopkins finished with four receptions for 32 yards and one touchdown.

Max Phinney added three catches for 37 yards. Derek Walters had two catches for 23 yards.

Defensively, Kyle Summers, Caleb Summers and Dilan Bollmann each registered eight tackles.

Jared Walde added six tackles. Schull recovered a fumble forced by Thomas McCain.

"Jared Walde was our defensive player of the game at the end position," Schneider said. "He did some really good things. If he continues that, he's going to open a lot of eyes as to what kind of talent he has."

### Washington Takes Down Timberland, 25-7

It was well worth the wait.

After having its football game at Timberland delayed one day until Saturday morning due to weather conditions, Washington got into the win column by handling the Wolves, 25-7.

"I told our coaches there were two ways we could look at having the game moved back a day, we could complain about it or we can really embrace it," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "We sold it to our kids that it was a great opportunity to go out there and get a win. My coaching staff did a great job selling that to the kids."

And the players took it to the field, controlling the game against Timberland.

"I'm tickled to death for the kids that we won. They embraced practicing out here before the game and playing in the mud," Schneider said. "I told the kids once we got out of the locker room, we weren't going back in. We were going to be in the rain. That's what we were here for. We didn't play a perfect game. It was sloppy. We put the ball on the ground. But we made plays when he had opportunities. Our mistakes didn't kill us."

#### Warrenton Preview

Washington returns to its home field Friday for a contest against Warrenton at 7 p.m.

The Warriors (0-2) have opened the season with home losses to St. Dominic 41-20 and Troy 35-19.

"Warrenton has played two very tough teams, St. Dominic and Troy. They played them pretty close," Schneider said. "They're going to throw the ball around a lot. Coach (Steve) McDowell is back there. He was the coach there in early 2000s. They do a lot of the same things that Coach (Ken) Moore did, who's at Holt now. They'll try to spread us out and throw the ball. Sometimes we've defended it well and sometimes it's been our Achilles' heel. So we'll have to work hard this week to prepare for it."

Warrenton quarterback T.J. LaFaver is a threat to both throw and run the football.

Other offensive threats are running back Devin Ray and receiver Devin Roberts.

"It's a home game and we should be able to win our home games," Schneider said. "We need to try to get that second win and get on a roll. We haven't had a record above .500 since two years ago week seven. It's a big opportunity for the kids to go to 2-1."

#### Line of Scrimmage

Schneider and Washington quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger both praised the Blue Jays' line of scrimmage for the victory over Timberland. Playing on wet and sloppy field conditions on Timberland's grass field, controlling the line was crucial and the Blue Jays won the battle over a bigger Wolves squad.

"I told our linemen before the game, if any of you guys leave here with clean jerseys, we're going to hit that hill Monday and run a lot," Schneider said. "They took it to heart. They talked about

playing nasty all day long. Those Timberland guys are huge. We just had to play down and dirty against them, and embrace it. They embraced it and did a great job."

## Scoring Summary

After a scoreless first quarter, the Blue Jays outscored Timberland 18-0 in the second quarter.

The defense got Washington on the scoreboard when Dilan Bollmann intercepted a pass and ran 33 yards for a touchdown.

Hasenjaeger scored on the two-point conversion to make the score 8-0 with 5:32 left in the second quarter.

"Dilan had several opportunities for an interception last week. He finally got one and returned it for a touchdown," Schneider said. "It was a good play for him and even better for him to run it in for a touchdown."

Washington quickly got the ball back and struck again when Randall Flotte ran 44 yards for a touchdown to increase the lead to 15-0 with 2:39 left in the second quarter.

The Blue Jays scored again right before halftime when Luke Hoemann booted a 45-yard field goal in less than perfect field conditions with seven seconds left on the clock.

### Field Goal Lifts Washington Over Warrenton, 35-34

As Luke Hoemann's 18-yard field goal sailed through the uprights, it completed a thrilling comeback last Friday for the Washington football team.

In a contest that bore a striking resemblance to the 35-34 overtime win in 2010 -- the Blue Jays won by the exact same score-- this time in regulation.

"We thought we should have ended the game earlier instead of in the final seconds, but it was just great to get the win," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "We fought back twice and showed a lot of heart. It's very encouraging to win the way we did."

#### Thrilling Finish

Trailing 34-32, Washington drove the ball to the Warrenton one-yard line, facing third-and-goal with under 20 seconds left to play and no timeouts at its disposal.

The Blue Jays decided to attempt a field goal and Hoemann kicked it through with 12.8 seconds left for the win.

"Luke has been a consistent kicker for us. It was shorter than an extra-point attempt and a straight-on shot, so we thought that was the right move," said Schneider. "We told Luke (Hasenjaeger), our holder, that if something went wrong, just chuck the ball out of the end zone and we'll try it again on fourth down. Everything worked out."

Coach Steve McDowell, who has been a part of over 200 games during his 21 years as Warrenton, said this was one of the most heart wrenching.

"I was so proud of how these kids played," said McDowell. "They could have given up at any point in time, but they just kept clawing their way back in."

Warrenton (0-3) has not beaten Washington since the series began in 2007.

"Our goal was to try to beat them this year to get that first victory," acknowledged McDowell.

### **Holt Preview**

Washington (2-1) plays its first-ever GAC Central game Friday at Holt at 7 p.m.

The Indians (1-2) defeated Timberland last week 10-0 after opening the season with losses to Francis Howell 18-14 and Hickman, 18-7.

"It will be one of our toughest challenges so far this season. I'd put Holt right up there with St. Clair. They've lost to two very good teams," said Schneider. "If we play a clean game with no turnovers, we'll have a chance to win. We have to put ourselves in position to win."

The game figures to be a battle between Washington's attacking offense against Holt's stingy defense.

"Holt has very good athletes, very good skill players and a great defensive line," Schneider said. "They are very solid on defense. Their down linemen are good. They set the tone for the rest of the defense."

### **Game Summary**

Following a 30-minute lightning delay that interrupted the first quarter, Warrenton took a 6-0 lead on a 46-yard pass from T.J. Lafaver to Devin Roberts.

Kyle Summers gave the Blue Jays a 7-6 lead on a 28-yard run to open the second quarter.

The host team extended that lead on the next drive when quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger hit Ben Gratza on a 21-yard touchdown strike.

The Blue Jays' celebration was short-lived, as Roberts returned the ensuing kickoff 85 yards for a score. But the Warriors continued to trail, after the second of three missed extra-point attempts on the night.

Summers tacked on a 13-yard touchdown run before half, giving Washington a 20-12 cushion.

"They started pounding it on us for a while," said McDowell. "We got sloppy on our tackling."

The Blue Jays built a two-touchdown lead early in the third quarter, as Hasenjaeger hit Brock Hopkins in the end zone on a 36-yard route.

Warrenton's rally began with 7:54 remaining in the third and extended into the fourth quarter.

Junior Luke Darity scored on a 14-yard pass and Roberts hauled in a 30-yard touchdown. The Warriors executed the two-point conversion on both, giving them a 28-26 lead with 9:02 remaining.

Washington countered, regaining the lead on a one-yard run by Summers three minutes later.

But the Warriors went ahead 34-32 on a six-yard run by Devin Ray with 2:14 left in regulation.

Washington timed its final drive almost perfectly, setting up Hoemann for an 18-yard chip shot with 12.8 seconds remaining.

"Both teams had their offense going in the fourth quarter. Their quarterback was red hot. I don't think he missed a pass in the fourth quarter," Schneider said. "We had to make plays to stay with them. We had a good mix of run and pass. I was proud of our execution. We didn't hurt

Hopkins finished with four catches for 67 yards and one touchdown.

Gratza added three receptions for 58 yards and one touchdown.

Alex Monehan had two catches for 44 yards. Derek Walters added one reception for 30 yards.

Defensively, Jared Walde led Washington with 10 solo tackles and six assists, including two sacks.

Kyle Summers added eight solos and one assist, including one sack.

Caleb Summers registered six solos and three assists. Dilan Bollmann had five solos and one assist. Austin Subke and Cody Summers both had four solos. DJ Quathem and Alex Schull both had one sack.

### Holt Rallies to Beat Blue Jays, 31-27

For the second week in a row, Washington's football game was decided in the final seconds. This time, the final result went against the Blue Jays in a 31-27 GAC Central loss at Holt. Washington (2-2, 0-1) led 27-10 after three quarters, but saw Holt score 21 points in the fourth period for the win.

"It was a rough one. They made plays to win it," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "I take more of the blame. We did some things down the stretch that we probably shouldn't have done. We should have won."

#### Closing Seconds

Leading 27-24, Washington was forced to punt the ball at approximately its own 30-yard line with under 30 seconds left in the fourth quarter.

The punt was blocked, giving Holt the ball at Blue Jays' 14-yard line with 19 seconds remaining. "I told Luke (Hasenjaeger) to just pooch the ball rugby style away from their returners, so there wouldn't be any kind of return. We should have just punted it away like we have all year," Schneider said. "If I had to do it again, I would have had Luke run out the back of the end zone. We still would've had a one-point lead and we would have kicked off to them with around 10 seconds left. They still would have needed a field goal to win. We'll learn from it."

The Indians took the lead when quarterback Kyle Coleman tossed a 14-yard touchdown pass to Drew Kitson to grab a 31-27 advantage with 12 seconds left.

"They ran a hitch route and we missed a tackle," Schneider said. "We probably blew only four or five assignments all night, but three of them led to touchdowns."

#### Ft. Zumwalt South

Two teams that lost leads in the final seconds of the game last week meet in week five as Washington hosts Ft. Zumwalt South in a GAC Central contest Friday at 7 p.m.

Like the Blue Jays, the Bulldogs lost a road heartbreaker last week against Ft. Zumwalt North, 21-14.

FZS (3-1, 0-1) started the season with wins over Troy 21-18, Howell Central 21-14 and Howell North, 42-6.

The Bulldogs are led by senior running back and University of Missouri recruit Chase Abbington, who has rushed for 602 yards and seven touchdowns this season. He rushed for 324 yards in the Howell Central game, but was held to 16 yards on 12 carries against Zumwalt North. Quarterback Brett Simon has thrown for 360 yards with four touchdowns and five interceptions. "North really frustrated Abbington. He's probably going to be motivated to have a good game against us," Schneider said. "We've done a really good job against the run. We can't let him get

free. We have to run to the ball and lock him down."

Washington accumulated 347 total yards, 234 passing and 113 rushing.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 17-29 passing for 156 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. He also rushed for 19 yards on 15 attempts.

Justin Schuler was 1-1 passing for 78 yards and one touchdown. He fired a touchdown pass after taking a lateral from Hasenjaeger.

Kyle Summers carried the ball 24 times for 85 yards and scored one touchdown. He also had three receptions for 18 yards.

Walters finished with four catches for 99 yards and two touchdowns.

Brock Hopkins added six receptions for 47 yards. Ben Gratzka had two catches for 46 yards. Max Phinney added two catches for one yard. Monehan had one reception for 23 yards and a touchdown.

"That's the best defense we've seen this season," Schneider said. "For us to do what we did should give our offense some confidence."

Defensively, Jared Walde led the Blue Jays with 10 solo tackles.

Dilan Bollmann added nine solos and one assist. Caleb Summers registered eight solos. Cody Summers had seven solos. Alex Schull recorded five solos and one assist. Kyle Summers had five solos.

Holt (2-2, 1-0) totaled 324 yards, 192 rushing and 132 passing. Tray Mitchell rushed for 108 yards on 26 attempts.

## Game Summary

Washington held leads of 13-7 after one quarter, 13-10 at halftime and 27-10 after three quarters. The Blue Jays scored first-quarter touchdowns on a 10-yard run by Kyle Summers and a 78-yard pass from Justin Schuler to Derek Walters.

Schuler caught a lateral from Hasenjaeger and then fired the touchdown pass to Walters.

"We've been working on that play for a couple of weeks," Schneider said. "Coach (Tim) Rinne developed the play and we executed it."

Third-quarter touchdowns by Washington were on a 23-yard pass from Luke Hasenjaeger to Alex Monehan and a six-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to Derek Walters.

"We played the exact game we want to with the exception of the last six minutes," Schneider said. "If we had gotten a first down in the last six minutes, we would have won."

## Summers Rushes for 300 Yards in Washington Victory

Kyle Summers and the Washington Blue Jays had a night to remember against Ft. Zumwalt South.

The Blue Jays (3-2, 1-1) scored 50 points in the second half, turning a 17-14 halftime lead into a 67-21 blowout victory over the Bulldogs.

"We've had the lead at halftime in all five of our games this year and we lost two of our first four games," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "That's something we talked about at halftime. We used last week's loss to Holt as a motivator. I challenged the kids to go out in the second half and bury them."

Summers, a junior running back, had a career game, finishing with 17 carries for a school-record 300 yards and three touchdowns.

"It was just a lot of hard work. I did the best I could," Summers said after the game. "The lineman up front blocked great. I would do anything for those guys. Our offense dominated the whole night."

Washington outscored FZS in the second half, 50-7.

"It was awesome. We played well all four quarters. We've had games where we didn't play all four quarters and lost. We didn't want to have that taste in our mouth again," said Washington lineman Jared Walde. "I've been waiting for a game like this since my sophomore year. It's nice to win a game like we did tonight."

### **Vianney**

Washington looks to keep its momentum going with a contest Friday at Vianney at 7 p.m. The Golden Griffins (1-4) opened the season with a 39-20 win over Howell North, but have since lost four straight games to Jackson 43-14, DeSmet 47-19, SLUH 69-35 and CBC, 54-6. "With their schedule, I'm sure Vianney is thinking they have a bit of a breather with us this week," Schneider said. "They're much better than what their record shows. They'll be focused and ready."

Vianney's last four opponents have a combined record of 16-3. The Griffins will face another red-hot offense this week.

"Coach told us that we've never beaten Vianney," said Walde. "We're hoping to change that." The player to watch for Vianney is junior running back Markel Smith, who is one of the top junior recruits in Missouri.

Smith has rushed for 859 yards and 10 touchdowns this season against quality competition.

"If we let Smith get free, we won't catch him. We have to keep him contained to four or five yards per carry," Schneider said. "They've given up some points, but they are talented on defense, too. They've faced some great linemen from DeSmet, SLUH's (Raymond) Wingo and some great CBC receivers."

### **Kyle Summers**

Washington has a high-powered running back of its own in Summers, who did much of his damage against FZS in the second half.

Summers carried the ball 13 times for 202 yards and scored all three of his touchdowns in the second half. His 300 rushing yards broke the school record of 278 yards by Brad Jacquin against St. James in 1996.

"I pulled Kyle aside at halftime and told him that they didn't want any piece of him," Schneider said. "Kyle is a contact guy. He runs harder after he's hit. He delivers bigger hits on the defenders than they do on him. You could tell by the third quarter, they didn't want to hit him anymore." Schneider also praised the Blue Jays' starting offensive line of Zach Ray, Dillon Bauer, Brad Hellebusch, Nick Thiel and Walde.

"Our line did a tremendous job. Zumwalt South had seven guys in the box, so we attacked the perimeter with our linemen pulling and our receivers blocking on the edge," Schneider said.

"Kyle played like a mad man. He hit the holes great," Walde said. "We blocked really well for him. He hit the holes and was gone."

### Statistics

Washington accumulated 563 total yards, 405 rushing and 158 passing.

"That's the way our offense is supposed to look like when we execute and don't turn the ball over," Schneider said.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 10-17 passing for 158 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions.

In addition to Summers' 300-yard performance on the ground, Max Phinney also gave the Blue Jays a spark. He carried the ball six times for 43 yards and scored two touchdowns. He also had two catches for 15 yards.

Randall Flotte rushed for 37 yards on eight attempts. He also had two catches for 29 yards. Caleb Curran carried the ball three times for 20 yards and scored two touchdowns.

Brock Hopkins finished with two receptions for 45 yards and one touchdown. Derek Walters had two catches for 48 yards. Collin Anderson added two receptions for 21 yards.

Defensively, Dilan Bollmann led the Blue Jays with 11 solo tackles and also returned an interception 63 yards for a touchdown.

Caleb Summers finished with eight solos and three assists. Justin Schuler added eight solos and one assist. D.J. Quathem registered seven solos. Nathan Kopp and Cody Summers both had five solos and one assist. Grant Aholt and Josh Luck both had an interception. Thomas McCain recovered a fumble.

"Our defense started a little slow, but we got going and shut them down," Walde said. "We wore them out. They were tired."

Ft. Zumwalt South (3-2, 0-2) accumulated 331 yards, 168 passing and 163 rushing.

Gerald McBurrows carried the ball 16 times for 77 yards and scored one touchdown.

Running back Chase Abbington, a University of Missouri recruit, did not play on offense because of an injured shoulder. He did play on defense.

### Game Summary

The Washington offense, which had seven rushing touchdowns in the game, moved the ball at will in the second half, scoring touchdowns on six of its seven possessions.

Ft. Zumwalt South scored first on a 42-yard touchdown run by McBurrows to make the score 7-0.

Washington tied the game 7-7 with 8:55 left in the first quarter on a six-yard touchdown run by Phinney with 8:55 left in the opening quarter.

The Bulldogs regained the lead 14-7 with 6:19 left in the second quarter when quarterback Bret Simon launched an 82-yard touchdown pass to Casey Owens.

Washington scored the final 10 points of the first half to lead 17-14 at halftime.

### Washington's Rally Falls Short at Vianney, 49-41

Vianney junior running back Markel Smith showed Washington why he is one of the top players, and recruits, in Missouri.

Smith, who is being recruited by many Division I schools, including Missouri, rushed for 437 yards on 35 carries and scored three touchdowns in the Griffins' 49-41 home win Friday over the Blue Jays.

Despite Smith's huge game and Vianney's 42-6 halftime lead, Washington still made a game of it. The Blue Jays (3-3) outscored Vianney 35-7 in the second half and had chances down the stretch.

"We had a really bad first half. Our guys were a little surprised by Vianney's level of physical play, especially their offense. We haven't seen anything like that all year. It's not like we couldn't compete, but we were a little taken back by it," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "I was proud of the way we came back in the second half. We had five or six minutes with a running clock that really hurt us. Otherwise, I think we could have come back. We ran out of time."

#### **Ft. Zumwalt North Preview**

Washington (1-1 in the GAC Central), returns to league action Friday at Ft. Zumwalt North. The Panthers (3-3, 1-2) lost last week at Holt, 19-12. Wins have come over St. Charles West 14-6, Mehlville 14-8, and Ft. Zumwalt South 21-14. Losses have been to Troy 14-0, Ft. Zumwalt East 38-26, and Holt.

FZN runs the triple option offense, led by quarterback Zach Hilliard. He has passed for 759 yards this season.

“They’re a solid team that plays hard. They’ve been in every game they’ve played this year,” Schneider said. “They don’t have a Markel Smith out there, but they’ll still be a handful. We need to play assignment football and make tackles. Offensively, we need to limit our mistakes. They haven’t given up a lot of points, but I think we can do some things against them. If we play our game, we can play with anyone.”

### **Markel Smith**

It was a career game for Smith, who has had a number of impressive performances at Vianney (2-4).

Smith, 5-10 and 205 pounds, has rushed for 1,296 yards in six games this season.

“He’s the best running back I’ve seen since I’ve been coaching at Washington,” Schneider said of Smith. “He’s well beyond where Montee Ball was during his junior year at Timberland. We beat Timberland during Ball’s junior year and held him to under 100 yards. Smith has put up big yards against really good teams. His ability to stop and start and then run through tackles is impressive. Their level of play on the offensive line was the difference in the game. And when you put Markel Smith behind them, that multiplies the problem.

“We just don’t see teams like Vianney. They’re a 2-4 team that plays in a conference (Metro Catholic) with teams full of Division I athletes. If they were in the GAC, they might be undefeated or have one loss.”

### **Statistics**

Washington did much of its offensive damage against Vianney in the second half, scoring 35 points, which included a six-minute stretch with a running clock.

The Blue Jays accumulated 480 total yards, 347 passing and 133 rushing.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 23-35 passing for 347 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions. In the second half, he was 15-16 passing for 290 yards and three touchdowns.

“Things clicked for Luke in the second half,” Schneider said. “There were times where they dropped nine guys into coverage and they still couldn’t stop us.”

Justin Schuler also saw some time at quarterback in the first half.

Randall Flotte also had a big night, scoring four touchdowns. He carried the ball 11 times for 92 yards and two touchdowns. He also had three catches for 114 yards and two touchdowns.

Brock Hopkins collected six catches for 92 yards and one touchdown.

Kyle Summers rushed for 22 yards on six attempts. Max Phinney carried the ball three times for 17 yards and had two receptions for 28 yards.

Collin Anderson finished with four catches for 41 yards. Ben Gratza added three catches for 26 yards. Derek Walters, 24 yards, and Caleb Curran, 15 yards, both had two catches. Alex Monehan had one reception for seven yards.

Defensively, Dilan Bollmann had a big game, registering 15 solo tackles, two assists and returned a fumble for a touchdown.

“Dilan had a tremendous game,” Schneider said. “He scored his third defensive touchdown of the year. He’s consistently at the right spot at the right time.”

Cody Summers added eight solos and one assist. Jared Walde and Kyle Summers both had eight solos. D.J. Quathem added six solos. Caleb Summers added five solos and two assists.

Vianney had 613 total yards, 470 rushing and 143 passing.

Garrett Staskewicz was 9-19 passing for 143 yards and three touchdowns.

### **Game Summary**

Washington pulled to within 49-41 on a 65-yard touchdown pass from Luke Hasenjaeger to Randall Flotte with 1:53 left in the game.

The Griffins took possession of the ball and ran out the clock for the win.

In the first quarter, Smith had touchdown runs of five, 58 and 87 yards to help the Griffins to a quick 21-0 lead. Staskewicz then threw three touchdown passes in the second quarter to Kyle Markway, Nick Allgeyer and Ethan Staskewicz to make the score 42-6 at intermission.

Flotte, Hopkins and Bollmann scored in the third quarter to trim the deficit to 49-27.

Flotte found the end zone twice in the fourth quarter.

“It’s a game we could have won. We probably needed to score 60 to do it, but I think we could have,” Schneider said. “We just made too many mistakes in the first half. If we can put four quarters together, we’ll be a tough team to beat.”

Washington's three GAC Central football games this season certainly have been entertaining. Two of the games have been decided in the final minute, including the Blue Jays' 14-10 victory last Friday at Ft. Zumwalt North.

"It was a back-and-forth game all night with a lot of punting and field position battles," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "Both defenses played well. We were fortunate to break a couple of big plays. Our defense won the game for us. We needed them and they stepped up. Our defense doesn't get the credit it deserves."

### Final Drive

Trailing 10-7, Washington quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger tossed a 54-yard touchdown pass to Randall Flotte with 54 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, which proved to be the game-winner.

The Blue Jays (4-3, 2-1) sealed the win on an interception by Michael Wadlow with 43 seconds left to play.

"We got the ball with about three minutes left to play, trailing 10-7. We started the drive by running the ball. We were close to breaking one all night," Schneider said. "We kept plugging away until we faced a fourth and six at around midfield."

On the fourth down play, Max Phinney caught a first down pass from Hasenjaeger.

"It was the play of the game," Schneider said of Phinney's reception. "Max made a great catch and got the first down by a couple of yards."

Two plays later, Hasenjaeger and Flotte connected for the game-winning touchdown pass.

"Randall was in the backfield and beat an outside linebacker on a swing route," Schneider said.

"Any time we have Randall one-on-one with a linebacker, I'll take that. Luke threw a good ball and Randall did the rest."

### Zumwalt East Preview

Washington plays a homecoming game Friday against Ft. Zumwalt East.

The Blue Jays can gain a share of the conference championship with a win and a Holt loss to Ft. Zumwalt South.

"South has a good team, so that could happen," Schneider said. "We have to take care of our own business. We have our hands full with Ft. Zumwalt East."

The Lions (5-2, 2-1) suffered their first conference loss Saturday to Holt, 35-13. They've also lost to Francis Howell, 14-0.

Wins have come against Howell Central 34-20, Howell North 42-20, Cape Central 21-7, Ft. Zumwalt North 38-26 and Ft. Zumwalt South, 48-30.

FZE runs a spread option offense, which revolves around sophomore quarterback Shane Barrett, who by far is the team's leading rusher.

“The quarterback runs the ball a lot. They also have a running back who can break one at any time,” Schneider said. “They’ll take shots down field with the pass. They are big up front. We have to control their size.”

The Lions’ player to watch on defense is senior outside linebacker Mason Burnett, who is being recruited by Division I schools.

“Burnett is 6-4, 220 pounds and runs well. He was a step behind (Ft. Zumwalt South’s) Chase Abbington in the 100-meter dash last spring,” Schneider said. “They move him around. He’ll also play inside linebacker and also on the end to come off the edge. He’ll run the ball sometimes for them as well.”

Washington currently stands in third place in the Class 5 District 4 standings, less than two points behind second-place Camdenton. Lebanon tops the standings. The first two seeds receive a first-round bye district play.

“We have a lot to play for,” Schneider said. “We have a chance for a share of the conference and a chance to get that second seed, which would be huge to get a bye.”

### Statistics

Washington accumulated 317 total yards against Zumwalt North, 179 rushing and 138 passing. Hasenjaeger was 16-25 passing for 138 yards and one touchdown.

Flotte scored both of the Blue Jays’ touchdowns, one rushing and one receiving. He carried the ball 15 times for 134 yards and had four receptions for 79 yards.

Phinney rushed for 19 yards on four attempts and had two catches for nine yards.

Kyle Summers carried the ball five times for 12 yards. Brock Hopkins had four receptions for 34 yards.

Alex Monehan (16 yards) and Caleb Curran (eight yards) both had three catches. Curran also rushed for eight yards on five attempts. Ben Gratza had one catch for five yards.

Defensively, Jared Walde led Washington with 11 solo tackles and four assists.

Caleb Summers finished with seven tackles. Dilan Bollmann added five solos and three assists.

Alex Schull had a sack. Wadlow had an interception.

The Panthers (3-4, 1-4) accumulated 226 yards, 157 rushing and 69 passing.

Quarterback Zach Hilliard was 8-15 passing for 69 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

Deon Lewis carried the ball 14 times for 78 yards.

Washington is seeded third in Class 5 District 4 and hosts sixth-seeded Smith-Cotton (2-7) in a first-round contest Friday at 7 p.m.

Admission to the game is \$4 for adults and \$2 for students.

“Smith-Cotton runs a double wing offense at times, similar to what Sullivan does. Other times they’ll run the option,” Schneider said. “They’ve struggled scoring points. They have a decent defense that has been put in tough spots. They have pretty good size.”

Smith-Cotton owns wins this season over Warrensburg 21-18 and O’Hara, 17-12.

Losses have come against Nixa 47-7, Helias 35-6, Hickman 56-7, Grain Valley 25-14, Clinton 33-12, Center (Kansas City) 42-7 and St. Pius X (Kansas City), 28-21.

“They play a tough schedule,” Schneider said. “It’s hard to get a good read on them because we don’t play anyone on their schedule. We’ll see how it plays out.”

The other first-round district game features fifth-seeded Rolla (1-8) at fourth-seeded Waynesville (3-6).

Top-seeded Lebanon (8-1) and second-seeded Camdenton (6-3) received first-round byes.

The Washington-Smith Cotton winner visits Camdenton in the district semifinals Wednesday, Oct. 31.

“It’s week 10 and we need a win to keep our season going,” Schneider said. “I’m sure some of the kids are looking ahead to Camdenton and we as a coaching staff will look at Camdenton a little because it would be a short week of preparation, but our focus will be on playing Smith-Cotton.”

### Washington Handles Smith-Cotton

Washington used a solid ground attack to advance in the Class 5 District 4 football playoffs. The Blue Jays (6-4) scored all six of their touchdowns with their rushing attack and rolled to a 45-14 victory over the Tigers.

“They did a great job taking away our passing game. Our line and our running backs did a good job. It was tough for them to stop us,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “In the last two weeks, we’ve thrown for 350 yards in one game and rushed for 400 yards in the next. That gives our future opponents something to think about.”

Washington travels to Camdenton (6-3) in the district semifinals Wednesday at 7 p.m.

#### Camdenton Preview

The third-seeded Blue Jays face the second-seeded Lakers for the right to advance to the district championship contest, which takes place Monday, Nov. 5.

Top-seeded Lebanon (8-1) hosts fifth-seeded Rolla (2-8) in the other semifinal contest.

Lebanon and Camdenton received first-round byes. Rolla won Friday at Waynesville.

“It’s a typical Camdenton team. They’re a physical team with good size. They do what they do, and they’re really good at it,” Schneider said. “Going there won’t be easy. It will be like a small college atmosphere. The place will be packed and full of purple.”

The Lakers, coached by Jeff Shore, son of legendary coach Bob Shore, had a 2-3 record after five weeks, but ended the regular season with four straight victories.

Losses came against Hillcrest 18-12, Lebanon 46-21 and Parkview, 35-28.

Wins have been over West Plains 39-15, Kickapoo 25-7, Rolla 19-6, Waynesville 36-0, Joplin 45-10 and Glendale, 49-0.

“Camdenton’s three losses have been against teams with spread offenses,” Schneider said.

“They’ve struggled against those type of teams.”

The Lakers’ defense has allowed just 16 total points during their current four-game winning

streak.

“They focus on stopping the run. It won’t be easy for us to run it,” Schneider said. “We really want to keep them unbalanced. We’ll try to go faster than we normally we. We’d like to get their linebackers outside the box and out in coverage.”

Camdenton faced some injuries early on, but as players recovered, the team gained momentum. The offense’s key weapon is the running duo Murphy Ward and Justin Bernabe. Ward is the school’s all-time leading rusher.

The passing game has been productive with quarterback Cory Simpson leading the way.

Simpson’s top weapons through the air have been Ryan Elliott and Kullen Carlock, with Chase Nugent as the tight end.

“They have two big-play backs. We have to do a solid job tackling them. We’ve already faced arguably the best running back in the state (Vianney’s Markel Smith), so it’s nothing our kids haven’t seen before,” Schneider said. “The quarterback takes good care of the ball. He’ll throw it 15 to 20 times and run it four or five times. He’s similar to the kid at Ft. Zumwalt East, except he doesn’t run it as much. They’ll run double tight, I formation and power I, and come right at us.”

Washington accumulated 495 total yards against Smith-Cotton, 397 rushing and 98 passing.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 9-17 passing for 98 yards.

Three Blue Jays rushed for over 100 yards in the game.

Kyle Summers carried the ball nine times for 116 yards and scored four touchdowns. He had scoring runs of 10, eight, six and 57 yards.

“We need Kyle so much on defense, he doesn’t get a lot of carries on offense,” Schneider said.

“He gets most of his carries when we’re inside the 15- or 20-yard line because he breaks tackles and carries people.”

Max Phinney rushed for 109 yards on nine attempts. He also had two receptions for 34 yards.

“Max has come on really strong,” Schneider said. “I wish we would have used him more this year. He plays with another gear, which brings another dimension to our offense.”

Randall Flotte had five rushes for 105 yards and one touchdown, a 73-yard score late in the second quarter.

“We lost some focus in the second quarter,” Schneider said. “Randall broke a big one, which got us back on track. He’s a nice weapon to have.”

Caleb Curran rushed for 55 yards on 11 attempts. He also had two catches for eight yards.

Dilan Bollmann rushed for a 12-yard touchdown on his only attempt.

Joe Meyer, Christian Hardesty and Hasenjaeger also had rushing attempts.

Brock Hopkins finished with four receptions for 43 yards.

Jared Walde, a starting offensive tackle, had one catch for 13 yards on a hook-and-ladder play.

“If we would have blocked that play right, Jared might have scored,” Schneider said. “He’s not a typical offensive lineman. He’s a pretty fast kid.”

Defensively, Nathan Kopp led Washington with six solo tackles and two assists. Walde added six solos.

Caleb Summers and Bollmann both registered five solos and two assists. Bollmann also had an interception. Kyle Summers added five solos and one assist. Alex Schull, Austin Subke and Luke Alsop each had five solos. Austin Hudson, Subke and Schull each recovered a fumble.

“We tend to do well against the type of offense Smith-Cotton runs. Our kids are more comfortable tackling in the box instead of chasing people around,” Schneider said. “We forced some turnovers and didn’t give up any big plays.”
