## Football Blue Jays Examine Shootout Loss

Usually when a quarterback throws five touchdown passes and runs for another, it adds up to a victory for his team.

Unfortunately for Washington, that wasn't the case in last Friday's football season opener at Ft. Zumwalt East.

In a GAC North showdown between the Blue Jays and the Lions, Ft. Zumwalt East survived a shootout over Washington, 50-42.

"We didn't put four quarters together, which has been a problem for us. We have to figure out a way to do that," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "We played two bad quarters and still had a shot to win. Ft. Zumwalt East has a very good team and is in the driver's seat to win the conference. It's a game we definitely could have had."

### Zumwalt South Preview

Washington plays its home opener Friday against Ft. Zumwalt South.

The Bulldogs (0-1, 0-1) lost their season opener at home to St. Charles West, 34-21.

"Zumwalt South is very similar to us offensively with what they do. They run a shotgun spread. They have a lot of skill kids with good size and speed," said Schneider. "St. Charles West pounded them with the run in their wishbone. They're a dangerous team. Hopefully we'll start the game well and not give them any confidence."

Ft. Zumwalt South is led by quarterback Brett Simon and running back Chase Abbington.

Against St. Charles West, Simon was 12-25 passing for 195 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. Abbington carried the ball 17 times for 86 yards and scored two touchdowns.

"We have Ft. Zumwalt South. They're going to be ready for us. We beat them last year," said WHS quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger. "It's a home game so hopefully we can come out and get them at home."

It was a huge game for both quarterbacks.

Washington junior Luke Hasenjaeger was 26-52 passing for 413 yards with five touchdowns and two interceptions. He also carried the ball seven times for 68 yards and one touchdown.

“I was excited about that. The linemen kept me protected. I didn’t hardly get hit. They opened up holes for everyone,” said Hasenjaeger. “The receivers were catching the ball. Everything just came together in the second half.”

FZE senior Brandon Barrett was 10-27 passing for 296 yards with four touchdowns and one interception. He carried the ball 19 times for 175 yards and one touchdown.

The two teams combined for over 1,100 yards of total offense.

The Blue Jays (0-1, 0-1) accumulated 587 total yards, 413 passing and 174 rushing.

The Lions (1-0, 1-0) totaled 534 yards, 296 passing and 238 rushing.

“We still left a lot on the field. We had four drives stall inside the 15-yard line and lost a fumble inside the 5,” said Schneider. “If we took advantage of all of our opportunities, Luke could have had 600 yards passing and we could have scored close to 70 points. We were still very productive. It should have been enough to win the game.”

## FZE Starts Fast

Washington grabbed an 8-7 lead midway through the first quarter on a Mike McGilvray 26-yard touchdown reception, but FZE dominated the remainder of the first half.

The Lions led 22-8 after the first quarter and 29-8 two minutes into the second period.

The Blue Jays made it 29-14 on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to Ben Menke. East led 36-14 at halftime.

## WHS Owns Third Period

Washington dominated the third quarter, outscoring the Lions 22-0.

Hasenjaeger fired scoring passes of 19 yards to Brock Hopkins and 37 and 30 yards to Dilan Bollmann to tie the game 36-36.

The Blue Jays then grabbed a 42-36 lead with 8:13 left in the fourth quarter on an 11-yard touchdown run by Hasenjaeger.

But East came back to take a 43-42 lead on a 58-yard scoring pass from Barrett to Mike Mahoney. The Lions struck again when Nick Weisenborn intercepted a pass and rumbled 44 yards for a score to make the score 50-42.

The Blue Jays had one final chance. They got the ball to the East 11-yard line with 11 seconds left, but an interception by Mahoney in the end zone sealed the win.

“We should have started the game better. The first half put us in a hole, giving up 36 points,” said Hasenjaeger. “In the second half, we decided to come out and play the way we should. Hopefully if we put it all together like we did in the second half, it will be a good year.”

## WHS Stats

Six different players had at least one reception for Washington.

Leading the way was McGilvray, who had eight catches for 130 yards and one touchdown.

Hopkins added seven receptions for 77 yards and one touchdown. Menke had six catches for 72 yards and one touchdown.

Bollmann had two catches, both of which went for touchdowns, for 67 yards.

In the backfield, Kyle Summers carried the ball 15 times for 56 yards and had two receptions for 57 yards. Randall Flotte rushed for 41 yards on 12 attempts and added one catch for 10 yards.

“Our skill players, even the guys who came off the bench, all did a very good job,” said Schneider. “Our line is almost always going to be outsized, but they competed well. We can always be more aggressive and more physical.”

Defensively for WHS, Trevor Shockley (one sack) led the Blue Jays with six solo tackles and two assists. Ben Gratza added six solos and one assist. Jared Walde (one sack) had six solos.

Chase Hellebusch (two sacks and one fumble recovery) and Cody Summers both had collected five solos and one assist. Clayton Hamai added three solos and five assists. Jacob Arnold had an interception. Jon Tudor and Kyle Summers both added one sack.

“We were very timid defensively in the first half. We missed too many tackles that put us in bad situations,” said Schneider. “We were a different team in the second half. We allowed just one offensive touchdown.”

## Blue Jays Fall in Home Opener

Hopes of competing for a GAC North football title are quickly slipping away for Washington just two weeks into the high school football season.

Playing their home opener last Friday, the Blue Jays (0-2, 0-2) lost their second league contest to start the season in a 38-28 setback to Ft. Zumwalt South.

“There’s still a lot to play for. You just never know. Ft. Zumwalt East already has a conference loss. Someone could still win the league with two losses,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “I think a lot of people will be shocked if St. Charles West goes undefeated in the conference. We still have a lot to play for, but we definitely need some help if we want to win the league.”

St. Charles West Preview

Washington hits the road in week three for a Friday matchup at St. Charles West in a GAC North contest.

The Warriors (2-0, 2-0) own victories so far this season over the two teams who have defeated Washington, Ft. Zumwalt South (34-21) and Ft. Zumwalt East (28-19).

“I think the four teams (Washington, St. Charles West, FZS and FZE) are pretty evenly-matched. St. Charles West has found ways to win two games and we haven’t,” said Schneider. “They’re a confident team and we’re trying to find some confidence.”

Kyle Anders handles the quarterback duties for West. He has thrown for 254 yards and two touchdowns in the first two games. He also has rushed for two touchdowns.

The Warriors appear to have a stable of solid running backs, including Ahren Bohanan, Austin Rugraff, Auggie Loschen and Marcus Taylor.

Ryan Finders has nine catches for 127 yards and two touchdowns this season.

“They run a wishbone offense with a lot of option. If they get up on people, they’ll pound the ball on the ground and eat up the clock,” said Schneider. “I think we match up with them pretty well. We’ve had success with these types of teams in the past. We just have to play with confidence and cut down on our turnovers.”

Casey Bartee and Rugraff have been the top two defenders for West through the first two games.

“Their defense has forced some turnovers against Zumwalt South and Zumwalt East in the first two games,” said Schneider.

## Turnover Problems

Turnovers continue to haunt Washington through the first two games.

“We’ve turned the ball over eight times in our first two games, four against East and four against South. Six of our eight turnovers have led to touchdowns,” said Schneider. “If our offense doesn’t turn the ball over, we’d be undefeated right now. Turnovers have been a killer for us. It’s something we really stress to our players, so it’s been frustrating.”

## WHS Defense

Schneider said Washington’s turnovers have put the defense in bad situations.

“I can’t stress enough that our defense isn’t playing that bad,” said Schneider. “When you have a young defense and a new scheme, you can’t have eight turnovers in two games on offense.”

Linebacker Clayton Hamai paced Washington with seven solo tackles and seven assists.

Jared Walde, Spencer Baird and Jon Tudor both added five tackles. Jordan Brown had three tackles, including a sack.

Washington quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger rushed for three touchdowns against South and threw for another.

The Blue Jays accumulated 457 total yards, 259 passing and 198 rushing.

Hasenjaeger was 16-34 passing for 259 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions. He also rushed for 73 yards on 14 attempts, collecting scoring runs of 18, 4 and 1 yards.

Randall Flotte carried the ball seven times for 70 yards.

Brock Hopkins had a six-yard touchdown reception from Hasenjaeger in the second quarter. He finished with five catches for 85 yards and one touchdown.

Max Phinney ended the game with three receptions for 83 yards. Mike McGilvray had one catch for 48 yards.

The Bulldogs (1-1, 1-1) accumulated 488 total yards, 277 rushing and 211 passing.

Zumwalt South quarterback Brett Simon was 13-23 passing for 211 yards and two touchdowns.

Chase Abbington carried the ball 23 times for 155 yards and scored two touchdowns.

Ft. Zumwalt South held leads of 14-7 after one quarter, 21-14 at halftime and 28-21 after three quarters.

“On our first drive, we got the ball inside the 10-yard line, but a penalty stalled it. On our second drive, we got inside the 20-yard line, but fumbled it away,” said Schneider. “We had a chance to get up on them early, but didn’t. That was frustrating. We had to play from behind all night.”

## Blue Jays Remain Winless With Loss

Another week, another close GAC North football loss for the Washington Blue Jays.

Washington (0-3, 0-3) fell short last Friday at St. Charles West, 39-27.

“We had the lead in the third quarter and had opportunities to put the game away, but didn’t take advantage of it,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “St. Charles West is a good team. Our conference has come a long way since we joined the North six or seven years ago. The talent level and the coaching is much better.”

Eureka Preview

Things don’t get any easier for the Blue Jays, who host Eureka Friday at 7 p.m.

The Wildcats (2-1) defeated Marquette last Saturday at the Edward Jones Dome, 48-0. They opened the season with a 35-28 loss to Lafayette and followed with a 57-33 victory over Mehlville.

“It’s going to be another tough game. Eureka has good size and speed. We can’t make mistakes,” said Schneider. “I think we’ll be able to do some things offensively. They’re a blitz-heavy team, which we invite because it opens space for our receivers. I think we’ll be able to move the ball, especially through the air.”

Washington’s defense will be challenged.

Eureka quarterback Seth Pratt has thrown for 751 yards and seven touchdowns in three games. Running back Spencer Stein has rushed for 398 yards and eight touchdowns. Aaron Schnurbusch has 240 receiving yards and three scores.

“Their quarterback is a good player,” said Schneider. “They’ll try to run the ball between the tackles and pound us. We have to neutralize their size up front. They’ll probably run the ball more and we’ll throw it more.”

Still Optimistic

Although the Blue Jays are winless in three games, there’s still plenty to play for this season.

“We have a bunch of opportunities ahead of us,” said Schneider. “We’re 0-3, but we’ve been doing some good things. We just need someone to step up and make plays when we need them. The effort is good, we just tend to make mistakes when the game is on the line.”

Washington is averaging 32 points per game.

“We’ve had opportunities to win all three of our games. As long as we keep plugging away, I think we’ll be fine,” said Schnieder. “I’m not upset with the kids. They’re not giving up. There’s no quit in them. We still have a lot to play for. We just need someone to step up and make plays in crucial situations.”

## Brief Lead

Trailing 18-13 to St. Charles West at halftime, the Blue Jays grabbed a 21-18 lead with just under five minutes left in the third quarter and had a chance to expand their lead.

“We got stopped at the two-yard line on fourth and goal, which would’ve put us ahead by 10 or 11 points with three minutes left in the third quarter,” said Schneider.

The Warriors (3-0, 3-0) took the momentum and came back to win.

“We did a really good job for three quarters limiting what they wanted to do offensively,” said Schneider. “We allowed (343) yards rushing in the game. At least 100, and probably more, of those yards came in the last 12 to 14 minutes. They wore us down in the end.”

## WHS Offense

Washington continued to pile up the yardage, accumulating 492 yards in the contest, 307 passing and 185 rushing.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 28 of 50 passing for 307 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions. He also rushed for 82 yards on 10 attempts.

“Luke is doing a good job. He started the game 12 for 13 passing,” said Schneider. “Turnovers are just killing us. We had two turnovers, both of which led to scores.”

Brock Hopkins had nine receptions for 91 yards and one touchdown. Mike McGilvray (70 yards) and Ben Menke (48 yards) both had five catches. Menke scored a touchdown. Derek Walters had two receptions for 26 yards and one touchdown.

Kyle Summers rushed for 52 yards on 12 attempts and had three catches for 12 yards. Max Phinney had two carries for 56 yards, including a 48-yard touchdown run. He also had two catches for 36 yards.

Washington played without starting running back Randall Flotte, who was sick.

“Not having Randall hurt, but we still ran the ball well and we threw the ball well,” said Schneider. “We have to cut down on our turnovers. We have 10 turnovers this season, eight of which had led to touchdowns. That’s the difference in our season.”

Scoring early and often, Eureka rolled to a convincing football win last Friday at Washington High School.

The Wildcats (3-1) scored on each of their five first-quarter possessions and cruised to a 49-6 win over the Blue Jays.

Eureka held leads of 35-0 after one quarter and 49-0 at halftime.

The Pirates (0-4, 0-4) also are winless on the season with conference losses to Warrenton 40-27, Ft. Zumwalt North 65-42, Ft. Zumwalt South 49-14 and St. Charles West, 49-13.

“The scary thing about St. Charles is they had success moving the ball and scoring points early in the year,” said Schneider. “They have some skill players that will be tough for us to match up with speed wise.”

The Blue Jays should be able to score points against the Pirates, who are allowing 50.8 points per game.

“If we continue to make some of the mistakes we’ve been making, we’ll allow them to be in the game,” said Schneider. “If we cut down on our mistakes, I think we’ll put together a good game.”

St. Charles quarterback Brandon Howard has thrown for 481 yards and is the team’s leading rusher with 278 yards.

Washington quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger has thrown for 1,151 yards in just four games.

Schneider said starting the game fast is a big key for both teams.

“I know we’re looking for some confidence and I’m sure they are as well,” said Schneider. “Whoever starts the game better will have a leg up. Hopefully we can build some momentum, improve on the mistakes we’re making and get some confidence going.”

“It’s coming up to week five now and it makes you wonder if that’s who we really are,” said Schneider. “Some of it could have been nerves, but we have to get those kinds of mistakes out of our system.”

## Eureka Takes Control

Eureka took the ball first to open the game and capped an 80-yard drive on a one-yard touchdown run by running back Eric Stein.

It was more of the same on the Wildcats’ next two possessions when Stein ran for touchdowns of 15 and 67 yards to make the score 21-0 with 3:43 left in the first quarter.

Eureka’s Aaron Schnurbusch then made his presence known in the first quarter when he tossed an eight-yard touchdown pass to Matt Hentges and then ran 23 yards for a score, both plays coming out of the Wildcat formation, to increase the lead to 35-0.

The Wildcats’ final two scores came in the second quarter on a 39-yard pass from quarterback Tyler Sloyer to Stein, his fourth touchdown of the game, followed by an 80-yard interception return for a touchdown by Cole Estrada with five seconds left until halftime.

Washington got on the scoreboard with 2:21 left in the third quarter on an eight-yard touchdown run by Kyle Summers.

Jefferson City (6-0) is ranked second in the state (all classes) and 18th in the country by [Masseyratings.com](http://Masseyratings.com).

“We did some good things. Jefferson City has a great team. What they do, they do very well,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “They’re big up front. That was the big difference. They’re 250 to 260 pounds up front across the board, which is a lot bigger than us.

“As far as the score is concerned, most of our starters were out of the game by the middle of the third quarter. It was basically a sophomore game the rest of the way and they scored a couple of times. Their last touchdown was on a fumble recovery in the end zone. Coach (Jeff City Coach Ted LePage) felt bad about it, but it was just one of those things.”

Schneider said Jefferson City and Eureka will no longer be on Washington’s schedule, mostly due to the changing of district formats beginning next season.

## Warrenton Preview

Washington, 1-3 in the GAC North, hosts Warrenton (1-5, 1-4) for homecoming Friday at 7 p.m.

The Warriors, who lost to Webb City in last year’s Class 4 state championship game, are coming off a 56-26 home loss to Union. They trailed 42-0 at halftime.

“Warrenton has had some injury problems,” said Schneider. “Their running back (Austin Black) didn’t play against Union. Their quarterback, who is very dangerous, is back from injury. I expect all of their injured players to be back this week.

“Warrenton is a lot like us in the fact that I’m sure they feel their record doesn’t reflect what kind of team they have. Both teams need some momentum going into districts. We’ll have our work cut out for us.”

Schneider said the Blue Jays should be in good shape if they overcome some obstacles.

“I want our kids to enjoy Homecoming Week, but we have to put in good practices and be ready to play Friday night. You can’t have a good homecoming unless you win the game,” said Schneider. “If we play the way we’re capable, we should be in position to win. If we make mistakes, we’ll have a hard time.”

Playing its final GAC North football game of the season, Washington returned to its winning ways with a homecoming victory last Friday over Warrenton.

The Blue Jays (2-5, 2-3) held the lead throughout the contest in a 47-12 victory over the Warriors.

“Our kids showed up and played really well, even with homecoming and all of the activities going with it,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “It’s a big win going into districts. Our kids are excited about what we have ahead of us.”

## Parkway West Preview

Washington opens Class 5 District 5 action Friday at Parkway West at 7 p.m.

The Longhorns, coached by former Washington Head Coach Jeff Duncan, own a 1-6 record.

Parkway West opened its season by defeating University City 47-33, but has since lost six straight games to Fayetteville, Ark., 49-7, Rockwood Summit 38-7, Seckman 35-0, Parkway Central 41-3, Webster Groves 52-10 and Parkway North 35-7.

The Longhorns won last season at Washington, 35-21, and reached the playoffs by placing second in the district behind Kirkwood.

Kirkwood (6-0) is the favorite to win the district. Vianney (2-5) is the other team in the district.

“Kirkwood is the team to beat, but you never know what can happen,” said Schneider. “Vianney might be the team everyone is overlooking. They probably play in the toughest conference out of all of us in the district. We feel like we have an opportunity to get in and at least get that second spot, if not the first. I’m sure Parkway West and Vianney feel the same way.”

Warrenton (1-6, 1-5) opens Class 4 District 8 play Friday at St. Dominic (7-0).

## Maintain Lead

The Blue Jays never trailed and held the lead for most of the way.

Washington held a 7-0 lead after one quarter on a three-yard touchdown run by Randall Flotte.

Kyle Summers ran 19 yards for a touchdown. Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger then fired a 25-yard touchdown pass to Brock Hopkins.

"The decision to go for two points and the win was an easy one. We felt that it gave us our best chance to win the game," said Duncan. "We already had an extra point blocked and were limited to what we could do offensively in overtime as we lost our quarterback. We liked what we had called on the two-point conversion. ## Blue Jays Fall to Kirkwood, Need Win to Reach Playoffs

It was a football game the Washington Blue Jays would rather forget.

Playing at home against state power Kirkwood, the Blue Jays suffered a 63-0 loss in a Class 5 District 5 contest.

Kirkwood (8-0, 2-0), ranked sixth overall in the state (all classes) by [Masseyratings.com](http://Masseyratings.com), scored all nine of their touchdowns in the first half. They Pioneers led 28-0 after one quarter and 63-0 at halftime.

“Kirkwood is a good team. They’re very talented. They can do that to a lot of teams,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “They’ll probably be in the thick of things when the Class 5 state championship is being decided a month from now.”

The Blue Jays (3-6, 1-1) didn’t help themselves. They turned the ball over four times in the first half, had a blocked punt result in a touchdown and mishandled another punt attempt, which pinned them deep into their own territory.

“We made it easy for them with turnovers and trouble on a couple of punts,” said Schneider. “They don’t need any help. You can’t give them more opportunities than they’d normally have.”

## Vianney Preview

The good news for Washington is the Blue Jays still control their own destiny.

The winner of Friday’s 7 p.m. game at Washington High School between the Blue Jays and Vianney secures a spot in the Class 5 playoffs. Kirkwood has clinched the district crown.

“We have to put the Kirkwood game behind us because we still have a lot to play for,” said Schneider. “We’re fighting for a playoff spot in week 10. Our kids are excited. It’s senior night and there should be a good crowd. We have a chance to get to playoffs and that’s all you can ask for. We’ll see what happens Friday.”

Vianney (3-6) is coming off a 26-0 victory last week over Parkway West. The Griffins also own wins over Northwest 17-0 and Francis Howell Central 29-22.

Losses have come against Ritenour 40-33, Chaminade 27-0, DeSmet 34-7, SLUH 48-0, CBC 47-15 and Kirkwood 42-20.

“Vianney plays in a really good conference with a lot of tough teams. Their six losses are against high quality teams,” said Schneider. “They’re a lot better than what their record shows. They’re very talented.”

The Griffins are led by sophomore running back Markel Smith (5-9, 200 pounds), who has rushed for 1,063 yards and has scored 13 touchdowns this season. He carried the ball 28 times for 198 yards and scored three touchdowns last week against Parkway West. He had even bigger numbers two weeks ago against Kirkwood, rushing for 222 yards on 24 attempts.

Smith rushed for 93 yards on 16 carries as a freshman in last year’s game against the Blue Jays. Vianney won the contest, 30-14.

“Smith started as a freshman for them last year. He’s a strong kid. If we can limit what he does, we’ll have a chance. If he goes off, we’ll be in trouble,” said Schneider. “They run a pro style offense, double tight with an I formation. Smith averages 20 to 25 carries a game. We have to tackle well. We can’t miss him. We have to get him down. They have size and speed that we’ll have to deal with.”

Washington hopes to have running back Randall Flotte back this week. Flotte has missed the last two games due to sickness and an injured ankle.

## Blue Jays End Football Season With Loss to Vianney

With a loss last Friday to Vianney, the football season came to an end for Washington.

The Blue Jays (3-7) suffered a 49-14 setback in a game that decided second place in Class 5 District 5 and a spot in the playoffs.

Kirkwood (9-0) claimed the district crown with a 3-0 record. The Pioneers have a first-round bye in the Class 5 playoffs and play the Holt-Waynesville winner in a sectional contest Nov. 7.

Vianney (4-6) placed second with a 2-1 district record. The Griffins travel to Camdenton in the regional round Wednesday at 7 p.m.

“Vianney is a good team that’s played a difficult schedule. I think they’ll pose a problem to Camdenton Wednesday night,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “We had three turnovers that led to 21 points for them. If you take that away, it could have been a different game.”

### Scoring Summary

Washington had trouble slowing down Vianney sophomore running back Markele Smith, who rushed for 209 yards and four touchdowns in the contest.

“Smith is a really good athlete,” Schneider said. “He’ll be one of the better running backs in the St. Louis area over the next two years.”

The Griffins held leads of 21-6 after one quarter, 28-14 at halftime and 42-14 after three quarters.

Trailing 7-0, the Blue Jays got on the scoreboard on a 67-yard touchdown run by Randall Flotte with 5:42 left in the first quarter to make the score 7-6.

With 4:48 remaining in the second quarter, Washington cut Vianney's lead to 21-14 when it scored on a reverse pass.

Mike McGilvray tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger. Ben Menke scored on the two-point conversion on a pass from Hasenjaeger.

Vianney took over from there, scoring four unanswered touchdowns to pull away for the win.

Washington accumulated 269 total yards, 187 rushing and 82 passing.

Hasenjaeger was 8-21 passing for 71 yards with no touchdowns and one interception.

"We continued to see teams do more and more to Luke to keep him guessing," Schneider said. "We need to look into that and make things easier for him next year."

McGilvray was 1-1 passing for 11 yards and one touchdown. He also had one catch for four yards and one rush for two yards.

Flotte had a big night, carrying the ball 10 times for 169 yards and one touchdown. He also had one catch for nine yards.

"Randall missed the previous two weeks. We really missed him because he gives us speed we need against those teams," said Schneider. "He's a good kid. I'm very proud of him for the game he had."

Menke finished with three catches for 39 yards. Hasenjaeger had one reception for 11 yards and one touchdown.

Kyle Summers rushed for six yards and had one catch for 10 yards. Chase Hellebusch rushed for 11 yards on two attempts. Max Phinney added two receptions for nine yards and rushed for two yards.

Defensively, Clayton Hamai and Hellebusch led the Blue Jays with 11 solo tackles apiece. Hellebusch added one assist.

Caleb Summers finished with seven solos tackles. Kyle Summers registered six solos and one assist. Spencer Baird added five solos and four assists. Jon Tudor, Cody Summers, Jordan Brown and Dillon Bollmann each had three solos. Cody Summers had an interception.

"We did some good things defensively," Schneider said. "Our offense put them in bad situations with the three turnovers."

## Season Review

Washington finished the 2011 season with records of 3-7 overall, 2-3 in the GAC North and 1-2 in Class 5 District 5.

The Blue Jays started the campaign 0-4, three of those setbacks were in competitive games against Ft. Zumwalt East, Ft. Zumwalt South and St. Charles West.

Other losses came against Eureka, Jefferson City, Kirkwood and Vianney.

Wins came against St. Charles, Warrenton and Parkway West.

“We had some opportunities to win games early in the year that we let slip away,” said Schneider. “Our No. 1 issue was ball control and taking care of the ball. Turnovers just killed us. We as coaches needed to do a better job emphasizing taking care of the ball to our kids.”

Hasenjaeger threw for 2,013 yards this season to go with 15 touchdowns and 18 interceptions. He also rushed for 546 yards.

Flotte led the team with 629 yards rushing. Kyle Summers rushed for 519 yards.

The team’s leading receiver was Brock Hopkins, who had 45 catches for 566 yards. McGilvray added 30 receptions for 494 yards. Menke had 26 catches for 354 yards.

Hellebusch led the Blue Jays with 83 total tackles. Hamai added 66 total tackles followed by Baird (51), Kyle Summers (49), Caleb Summers (48) and Jared Walde (46).

## Looking Ahead

Hopes will be high for a turnaround season in 2012.

“We’ll have a big senior class next year who got a lot of playing experience this year,” said Schneider. “We have to get stronger and faster, but that’s not going to happen overnight. We’ll fight through it. We have to be a more confident team.”

Schneider said he believes in his players.

“We compare well to the other teams in this area, we just don’t play them anymore. I think we stack up well with all of them,” said Schneider. “I’d put Randall Flotte up against anyone. The problem is the other teams in our district and in Class 5 have three or four Randall Flottes and they’re much bigger than we are. It’s going to be a process, but I’m looking forward to the future. We’ll be able to compete well.”
