Blue Jays Open With Ft. Zumwalt East

Washington's defense was in midseason form during last Friday's jamboree at Washington High School.

The jamboree included Washington, Borgia, St. Mary's and Westminster. Each team ran 12 plays on both sides of the ball against the other three squads starting at the 40-yard line.

"We improved on some things throughout the week and ended the week on a high note," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "I saw some good things at the jamboree, but there also were things that we need to improve on. It gave us a better idea of what we need to work on this week."

The Blue Jays' defense stood tall at the jamboree. They did not allow a touchdown in the 36 total plays.

“I was very pleased with our defense for not allowing a touchdown. We gave up very few yards,” Schneider said. “No disrespect to the teams we played, but when you have teams on your schedule like Ft. Zumwalt East, Eureka, Jefferson City, Parkway West, Vianney and Kirkwood, we’re going to see higher caliber athletes during the regular season. Our guys know we still have to get better on defense. It all starts Friday night.”

Offensively, Washington scored three touchdowns on the night, two against St. Mary’s and one against Westminster.

“We moved the ball and had opportunities to score, but either turned it over or made mistakes to end drives,” Schneider said.

Luke Hasenjaeger and Mike McGilvray saw playing time at quarterback for WHS.

“I think Luke was 8 for 12 passing on the night with two interceptions, neither of which were really his fault. Our receivers ran poor routes on both interceptions. Luke probably shouldn’t have made the passes. For a sophomore, I was proud of the way he played.

“Mike can do a lot of things at quarterback. He’s definitely a runner. A key for him will be to complete a high percentage of his passes to make opposing defenses respect his arm.”

Washington’s running game is a work in progress.

“It’s getting better. Kyle Phipps didn’t play and Jesse Crider only got a couple of carries. The rest of them went to a sophomore,” Schneider said. “We were thin on the offensive line with injuries, but once they heal this week, we should be fine.”

There were no touchdowns scored by either team in Washington’s contest against Borgia.

“Offensively, we shot ourselves in the foot at times. Hat’s off to Borgia’s defense. They have a very good defensive line. They were very strong defensively up front,” Schneider said. “Our defense played lights out against them. We didn’t give up a whole lot of yards.”

The jamboree at WHS was a success.

“Coach (Bill) Deckelman did a great job organizing the jamboree,” Schneider said. “We got through it without any rain and it looked like all four teams had a good time and prepared well for the season.”

Ft. Zumwalt East

Washington opens the regular season Friday at home against Ft. Zumwalt East at 7 p.m.

It’s a battle of the top two finishers in the Gateway Athletic Conference North last season.

The Lions of FZE won the conference crown with a 6-1 record. They were 8-3 overall, losing in the first round of the Class 4 playoffs to Hannibal.

Washington placed second in the league with a 5-2 mark, going 7-4 overall. The Blue Jays lost to Rolla in the first round of the Class 5 playoffs.

Ft. Zumwalt East has moved up to Class 5 this season.

Last season, Washington lost at Ft. Zumwalt East, 23-19.

The Blue Jays held a 19-0 lead late in the second quarter, but were outscored 23-0 for the remainder of the contest.

“Going into the season, Ft. Zumwalt East has to be considered the favorite in the conference,” Schneider said. “They have a lot of people returning from last year, including their quarterback, who killed us last year.”

Senior Marvin Byrd is the Lions’ quarterback. Against WHS last season, Byrd carried the ball 32 times for 155 yards and one touchdown. He also was 13-25 passing for 173 yards and two touchdowns.

East runs a no-huddle, spread offense. The Lions prefer to run the ball, but can also throw it.

“Byrd is going to get his yards. We just have to hold him in check and stop everyone else,” Schneider said. “Basically, it comes down to whether we can tackle them. I think we had 15 missed tackles against them last year.”

FZE runs a 4-3 defense with a four-man front, three linebackers and four defensive backs.

“They’ll probably man up a lot and put seven players in the box,” Schneider said. “They like to blitz and put pressure on the quarterback. When they blitz us, we have to complete passes. We have to be consistent running the ball. There can’t be many negative runs. We have to have positive gains.”

Blue Jays Open With Loss to Ft. Zumwalt East

Ft. Zumwalt East showed why it is the preseason favorite to win the North Division of the Gateway Athletic Conference this season.

Opening the football season last Friday at Washington High School, the Blue Jays started slow and could not recover in a 40-14 loss to the Lions.

“We played a fairly clean game. We didn’t have a lot of penalties or turnovers,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “Defensively, we had three mistakes in our coverages that led to 21 points. Offensively, we couldn’t start drives consistently in the first half.”

Ft. Zumwalt East (1-0, 1-0) jumped to a 20-0 lead early in the second quarter and never looked back.

“They’re stacked. This is their big year. They have a lot of seniors and a lot of experience,” said Schneider of Ft. Zumwalt East. “They were more physical than us. They’re big up front and we struggled against that. It’s going to be a process this year. We have a lot of seniors, but not a lot of seniors with experience.”

The Blue Jays accumulated 273 total yards, 153 passing and 120 rushing.

Making his first varsity start, Washington sophomore quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 18-41 passing for 153 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

“Luke finished the game 14 for 26 passing. He showed himself that he can throw the ball on this level,” Schneider said. “He got hit quite a bit. They were constantly in his face with pressure. He withstood that and grew up a lot. His responsibility is only going to grow.”

Washington’s leading rusher was Kyle Phipps, who carried the ball 11 times for 91 yards and scored one touchdown. Jesse Crider rushed for 29 yards on five attempts.

“Kyle and Jesse both ran the ball pretty well,” Schneider said. “We had negative rushing yards from everyone else. We’re probably going to have to throw the ball and spread the field to set up the run.”

The Blue Jays’ leading receiver was Adam Hawkinson, who finished with six catches for 49 yards. Sam Kosark totaled four catches for 44 yards. Marc Goebel added three catches for 18 yards. Max Phinney had two receptions for 10 yards. Mike McGilvray (16 yards), Luke Hoemann (8 yards) and Brock Hopkins (8 yards) each had one catch. Hopkins’ reception went for a touchdown.

Defensively, Clayton Hamai led Washington with nine solo tackles and four assists. Adam Gildehaus finished with four solos, two assists and one interception. Joe Hughes and Robert Luck both had four solos and one assist. Brandon Walker registered four solos. Andrew Baker had three solos and four assists.

“We had three blown coverages and didn’t tackle extremely well,” Schneider said. “Those things are correctable.”

The Lions did not start their all-conference quarterback from last season, Marvin Byrd. He watched the game from the sideline until finally taking over at quarterback late in the third quarter. Byrd had touchdown runs of 5 and 18 yards in his two possessions at quarterback.

Brandon Barrett got the start at quarterback for the Lions and was 8-18 passing for 166 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. He also carried the ball 19 times for 82 yards and one touchdown.

FZE accumulated 376 total yards, 210 rushing and 166 passing.

The Lions held leads of 14-0 after one quarter, 20-7 at halftime and 34-14 after three quarters.

“We needed to stay in the game to have a chance. Once they got rolling, we knew it was going to be tough,” Schneider said. “We had to play a really good game to have a chance and that didn’t happen.”

Washington (0-1, 0-1) scored on a 45-yard touchdown run by Phipps with 7:32 remaining in the second quarter and on a 8-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to fellow sophomore Hopkins with 2:55 left in the third quarter.

“It boils down to we didn’t play very well defensively,” Schneider said. “When you have a young offense, you can’t give up the points we did.”

Washington looks to rebound with a week two matchup at Ft. Zumwalt South (0-1) Friday at 7 p.m. South lost its opener to St. Charles West, 16-0.

It will be the Bulldogs’ first game on their new turf field.

“They’ve lost 21 or 22 straight games, so they’ll be fired up and looking for a win,” Schneider said. “They have all kinds of athletes and a lot of speed. We’ll probably have more size up front than them, which is different for us. If we play the way we’re capable of playing, we should be able to handle our business.”

Blue Jays Knock of Fort Zumwalt South

Washington's defense stood tall in helping the team to its first football victory of the season.

Playing last Friday night at Ft. Zumwalt South High School, the Blue Jays shut down the Bulldogs in a 16-0 GAC North win.

"I can't say enough good things about our defense. They played a great game," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "Offensively, we moved the ball. We have to find ways to punch it in."

Washington (1-1, 1-1) held leads of 3-0 at halftime and 9-0 after three quarters.

The Blue Jays had other opportunities to break the game open.

On the opening kickoff of the contest, Washington's Tyler Jackson recovered a fumble at South's seven-yard line. Robert Luck forced the fumble.

But the Blue Jays could not take advantage, losing the ball on downs.

"We have to figure out how to be more productive and focused in the first half," Schneider said. "We were 0-4 passing on our first possession and got no points after recovering the fumble on the opening kickoff. We can't start the game that way."

The Blue Jays finally got on the scoreboard with 1:33 left in the second quarter on a 27-yard field goal by Sam Kosark.

Washington held the 3-0 advantage at halftime.

The first touchdown of the contest came with 3:06 remaining in the third quarter on a five-yard run by Dillon Bollmann to increase Washington's lead to 9-0.

The Blue Jays put the icing on the cake late with 3:16 remaining in the fourth quarter on a 18-yard touchdown run by Kyle Summers to make the score 16-0.

"Offensively, we weren't great, but we moved the ball, especially in the second half," Schneider said. "We played with a greater sense of urgency in the second half. We just have to do a better job putting the ball in the end zone. I think we have the kids who can do that."

The Blue Jays accumulated 349 total yards, 239 passing and 110 rushing.

Washington sophomore quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger directed the offense. He finished the contest 30-41 passing for 239 yards with no touchdowns and two interceptions.

The Blue Jays played without starting running back Kyle Phipps, who had a leg injury.

Bollmann, also a sophomore, carried the ball 14 times for 71 yards and scored one touchdown. Jesse Crider rushed for 14 yards on four attempts.

Mike McGilvray led Washington in the receiving department with eight catches for 75 yards.

Adam Hawkinson and Kosark both finished the game with six receptions. Kosark totaled 50 yards receiving while Hawkinson had 49 yards.

Marc Goebel added three catches for 22 yards. Brock Hopkins had two receptions for 22 yards. Clayton Hamai and Brandon Garrard both had two catches. Max Phinney had one reception.

"Once our kids got into the groove of the game, they were good," Schneider said. "I thought we played much better in the second half."

Defensively, Luck had two interceptions for the Blue Jays.

Hamai led WHS with nine solo tackles and five assists. Andrew Baker added five solos and two assists. John Phinney registered four solos and two assists. Adam Gildehaus collected three solos and four assists. Jordan Heath had three solos.

"I'm very proud of the way our defense tackled," Schneider said. "We didn't give up any big plays."

Washington held Ft. Zumwalt South to 174 total yards, 87 rushing and 87 passing.

South quarterback Marcus Lemasters was 9-21 passing for 75 yards.

“Our kids played hard, but we just have to start games better,” Schneider said. “We have to get over the hump in the beginning of the game.”

Washington returns to home action Friday with a week three GAC North contest against St. Charles West (1-1, 1-1).

“We’re probably a spitting image of each other,” Schneider said of St. Charles West. “It’s an evenly matched game. It will be a battle. We have to start the game well. That will be one of our main goals.”

Blue Jays End Strong, Defeat SCW

A dominating fourth quarter lifted Washington to a come-from-behind football victory last Friday night.

The Blue Jays trailed St. Charles West 10-7 after three quarters, but scored 21 unanswered points to start the final period and claimed the GAC North contest, 28-17.

"I can't say enough about the way our kids fought back in the fourth quarter," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. "When we had to make plays in the fourth quarter, we made them on both sides of the ball. I'm extremely pleased with the result."

Washington accumulated 393 total yards, 248 passing and 145 rushing.

"We're still making the transition into this offense," Schneider said. "We've been a run-first team here at Washington forever. It's taken some time to ease into this."

Washington sophomore quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 15-27 passing for 248 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions.

"We started a little slow in the beginning. We couldn't find the rhythm," Hasenjaeger said. "In the fourth quarter, we started moving the ball a little and found our rhythm. The offensive line did a heck of a job. They're a big reason why we won. I don't think I even got touched thanks to them."

Hasenjaeger's favorite target was Marc Goebel, who finished with five catches for 124 yards and two touchdowns. Both of his scores came in the fourth quarter.

"It took us three quarters to find that matchup, but we found it in the fourth quarter," Schneider said. "We worked on their left cornerback quite a bit. All five of Marc's catches were in the fourth quarter."

Mike McGilvray registered four catches for 47 yards. Adam Hawkinson added two catches for 14 yards.

Brandon Garrard had one reception for 29 yards and a touchdown. Dilon Bollmann added one catch for 10 yards and a touchdown. Brock Hopkins caught one pass for 14 yards. Sam Kosark had one reception for 10 yards.

Kyle Phipps carried the ball 10 times for 52 yards. Bollmann rushed for 42 yards on 12 attempts. Kyle Summers rushed for 38 yards on 11 carries.

“We want our running backs to get those four- and five-yard runs and not fumble the ball. Both of their touchdowns came on the result of our fumbles,” Schneider said. “Luke is a sophomore who is inexperienced. He’s going to throw some interceptions. We can’t compound that by putting the ball on the ground.”

It was another solid defensive effort by the Blue Jays.

St. Charles West’s touchdowns came on a defensive fumble recovery and a 10-yard pass with 2:30 remaining in the game.

Leading the way was safety Clayton Hamai, who finished with eight solo tackles and two assists.

“It’s the third game in a row Clayton has had double digit tackles,” Schneider said. “He’s had three solid games.”

Adam Gildehaus added six solo tackles and one assist. Danny Heimann had four solos and three assists. Robert Luck had four solos and two assists.

Joe Hughes recovered a fumble that was forced by Jordan Heath. Gildehaus also had a fumble recovery. Luck had an interception.

“Our defense was amazing. They kept us in the game,” Hasenjaeger said.

“Both of our defensive tackles, Joe Collins and Joe Hughes, played well,” Schneider said. “We took away what they wanted to do. They’re a big option team, but they threw the ball 35 or 36 times. We took them out of their comfort zone.”

Washington took a 7-0 lead with 3:54 left in the second quarter on a 29-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to Garrard.

St. Charles West (1-2, 1-2) got a 24-yard field goal from Mike Gesell on the final play of the first half to make the score 7-3 at halftime.

The Warriors grabbed a 10-7 advantage with 1:12 left in the third quarter when Austin Rugraff recovered a fumble and raced 30 yards for a touchdown.

Washington took over from there.

The Blue Jays capped a 99-yard scoring drive when Hasenjaeger fired a 14-yard touchdown pass to Goebel on a fourth down and four play with 8:07 remaining in the fourth quarter play to give WHS the lead for good, 14-10.

Hasenjaeger and Goebel hooked up again on a 61-yard touchdown pass with 4:48 left to play to increase Washington’s lead to 21-10.

The Blue Jays put the icing on the cake with 3:43 remaining in the fourth quarter on a nine-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to Bollmann to increase the lead to 28-10.

Washington visits Eureka (3-0) Friday at 7 p.m.

“Eureka is not as big as I thought they’d be, but they’re physical, fast and well-coached. Their kids are put together,” Schneider said. “Their quarterback runs the ball, they throw screen passes and they take shots downfield. I’m anxious to see how they play us defensively. We expect them to try to put as much pressure as possible on our sophomore quarterback. If we play the way we’re capable of, we can compete with them and have a chance for a win. We have to play to the best of our ability. It’s a chance for us to get some recognition in the St. Louis area.”

Blue Jays Drop Game at Eureka

Playing on its home field, Eureka started fast and never looked back in a 52-14 football victory Friday over Washington.

The Wildcats jumped to a 28-0 advantage after one quarter.

“We’re a better team than what the score shows. It’s not the way we wanted to start the game. Eureka is good at what they do,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “I was upset with how we tackled. It was our worst tackling game of the year by far. We were in position, but just didn’t make the plays. We needed to be more physical defensively at the beginning of the game.”

Washington (2-2) scored both of its touchdowns in the second quarter, outscoring Eureka 14-3 during that time, but the damage had already been done.

“After the first quarter, we settled in and played better. We didn’t play great, but at least our offense got some things going,” Schneider said. “We just made too many little mistakes that you can’t make against a good team.”

Eureka (4-0) added three touchdowns in the third quarter to make the score 52-14.

On the opening kickoff of the second half, Eureka's Drew Stevens recovered a WHS fumble and raced 20 yards for a touchdown, which all but sealed the victory.

"We scored twice in a row to make it 31-14 at halftime. We felt like if we could put some points on the scoreboard to start the third quarter, it could be a different game," Schneider said. "It was frustrating that we didn't give ourselves a chance to do that. We left a lot of scoring opportunities on the field."

Washington quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger tossed second-quarter touchdown passes of seven yards to Brock Hopkins and 48 yards to Marc Goebel.

For the game, Hasenjaeger was 17-44 passing for 269 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions.

Rushing yards were hard to come by for the Blue Jays, who managed 55 yards on the ground on 22 carries.

Freshman Kyle Summers carried the ball four times for 31 yards. Kyle Phipps rushed for 18 yards on 10 attempts.

Goebel (93 yards), Mike McGilvray (79 yards), Hopkins (38 yards) and Sam Kosark (30 yards) each finished with three receptions. Max Phinney (14 yards) and Brandon Garrard (six yards) both added two catches. Adam Hawkinson had one catch for nine yards.

"We moved the ball. When you put up that much yardage, you have to score more than 14 points," Schneider said. "We struggled running the ball. Eureka was physical up front. We did a tremendous job pass blocking. Coach Shelton (Eureka Coach Farrell Shelton) told me they stopped blitzing because they couldn't get to us. We just have to do a better job run blocking."

Defensively, safety Clayton Hamai led Washington with 12 solo tackles and two assists. Joe Hughes added six solos and two assists. Danny Heimann had four solos and one assist. Jordan Heath had four solos.

"Clayton was our only sure tackler," Schneider said. "He played really well."

Eureka quarterback Sean Strehl was 15-20 passing for 205 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 89 yards on 11 attempts and scored one touchdown.

Spencer Stein of the Wildcats carried the ball 12 times for 156 yards and scored one touchdown. Chase Bollinger had 10 catches for 164 yards and two touchdowns.

"Eureka has some talented players, but a lot of it was us not making plays when we had the opportunity to make plays," Schneider said. "Our kids know we have to get better because Eureka is the type of team we'll be facing down the road."

Washington has a homecoming contest against St. Charles (0-4) Friday at 7 p.m.

"St. Charles has a new coach and a new system that they're growing into. They played St. Charles West tough last week," Schneider said. "If we play with the mindset that we're going against Eureka or Jefferson City, then we'll play well and have fun on our homecoming. If we have the mindset that we're going against a winless team, then we're going to struggle. We have to practice well this week and have a good approach to the game."

Blue Jays Roll Past St. Charles

In between challenging nonconference games against Eureka and Jefferson City, Washington faced a GAC North homecoming contest against winless St. James.

The Blue Jays (3-2) did not dwell on last week's loss to Eureka or look ahead to this week's showdown with Jefferson City, instead they focused on the Pirates in a 52-12 victory.

"We were ready to play. We played at a higher level than we have in previous games. I'm very proud of the effort," said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider.

Washington set the tone early in the game.

The Blue Jays took a 7-0 lead just 77 seconds into the game, led 14-0 after one quarter and outscored St. Charles 26-6 in the second quarter to lead 40-6 at halftime.

"We had a good first half. We could have had a better second half," said Washington receiver/defensive lineman Brandon Garrard. "Our offense is a lot better now than it was in week one."

Starting strong is an area the Blue Jays have concentrated on doing.

"It was nice to see us get off to a good start in the beginning of the game," Schneider said. "We got off to a fast start offensively, which was one of the best things we did all night. To get that fast start is really good for us."

Washington quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger was 17-32 passing for 249 yards with four touchdowns and one interception. He also rushed for 52 yards on seven carries.

Three of Hasenjaeger's touchdown passes went to Garrard, who finished the game with seven receptions for 126 yards and three touchdowns.

"Luke and I are getting a better connection. We just have to keep it going," Garrard said.

"It's just one of those things where Brandon was the guy tonight. They didn't cover the tight end particularly well. He got open and did a good job catching the ball and running in space," Schneider said. "He's a kid who was an offensive lineman for the last three years and worked hard to become a receiver. I couldn't be happier for him."

Mike McGilvray finished with three catches for 56 yards and one touchdown. He also returned a punt for a touchdown. Max Phinney added three receptions for 33 yards. Marc Goebel chipped in with two catches for 14 yards. Brock Hopkins had one catch for 12 yards. Kyle Phipps added one catch for eight yards.

Phipps led Washington's ground attack. He carried the ball 20 times for 133 yards and scored two touchdowns. Dillon Bollmann rushed for 32 yards on six attempts. Jesse Crider carried the ball six times for 23 yards and one touchdown. Robert Luck rushed for 12 yards on four attempts. McGilvray had six yards on two carries.

Washington accumulated 507 total yards, 258 rushing and 249 passing.

Defensively, the Blue Jays held St. Charles to 45 yards rushing on 19 attempts. The Pirates threw for 221 yards.

Joe Hughes had a big game, finishing with five solo tackles, one assist, two sacks and a blocked punt. He also recovered the ball on the blocked punt.

“Joe has been one of our most consistent players week after week as far as doing what he’s supposed to do and playing at a high level,” Schneider said. “I’m tickled to death for him. He played his heart out.”

Caleb Summers added four solo tackles and three assists. Bollmann registered three solos and two assists. Joe Collins, Tyler Jackson and Luck each had three solos and one assist. Luck also had an interception. Danny Heimann added a sack and an interception.

“I was really proud of our defense and the way they started the game,” Schneider said. “They played a really good game overall. We improved our tackling.”

Washington’s first-quarter touchdowns came on a 41-yard pass from Hasenjaeger to McGilvray and a 13-yard pass from Hasenjaeger to Garrard.

Second-quarter scores for the Blue Jays were runs of 41 yards and one yard by Phipps, a 17-yard pass from Hasenjaeger to Garrard and a 73-yard punt return by McGilvray.

Fourth-quarter touchdowns for WHS were a 24-yard pass from Hasenjaeger to Garrard and a four-yard run by Crider.

Luke Hoemann booted four extra points for WHS.

St. Charles (0-5, 0-5) scored on a 76-yard pass play from Austin Olendorff to Matt Glanzer and a 54-yard interception return by Antonio Smith.

Washington hosts Jefferson City (3-2) Friday at 7 p.m.

“My biggest concern is they are Jefferson City. Their name alone beats most teams before they step on the field,” Schneider said. “We have to get our kids to believe in themselves, to not be in awe of Jeff City, to prepare at a high level this week and be certain that we can walk on that field and compete. We want to have a good showing and put ourselves in a position to win in the fourth quarter.

“We have to be sound tackling. Jefferson City has two very good running backs who can be difficult to bring down. Offensively, we can’t have a slow start like we did against Eureka.”

Washington’s final five games of the regular season all figure to be big challenges.

“We have a tough schedule the rest of the way,” Schneider said. “We have Jefferson City this week. Warrenton is next week and they’re playing very well. Then we head into districts with three teams that are traditionally three pretty good football teams in Parkway West, Kirkwood and Vianney.”

Washington hopes playing teams like Eureka and Jefferson City helps it prepare for district competition at the end of the season.

Playing Friday against perennial power Jefferson City, the Blue Jays competed for most of the game in a 41-3 home setback.

Washington did not have an answer for Jefferson City running back Kody Walker, who has verbally committed to the University of Arkansas.

Not only did Walker rush for three touchdowns in the game, but he also became the all-time leading rusher in the program's storied history. He had touchdown runs of 27, 71 and 31 yards.

Jefferson City (4-2), which plays Rockhurst this week, had additional touchdowns on a 74-yard pass from quarterback Thomas LePage to Devon Moore, a 25-yard pass from LePage to Sam Turner and a 48-yard run by Turner, who was playing quarterback at the time.

Washington's lone points came on a 32-yard field goal by Sam Kosark with 1:31 left in the second quarter.

Trailing 13-0 late in the second quarter, the Blue Jays had the ball first and goal from the Jefferson City one-yard line, but had to settle for a field goal.

What could have easily been a 13-7 Jefferson City lead at halftime turned out to be a 20-3 advantage at intermission.

"We needed that one," Schneider said. "We needed it to be 13-7 at half, not 20-3."

Jefferson City held leads of 7-0 after one quarter, 20-3 at halftime and 41-3 after three quarters.

Washington accumulated 193 total yards, 114 passing and 79 rushing.

Robert Luck and Trevor Shockley both added three solos. McGilvray had two solos. Danny Heimann had one solo and three assists. Hawkinson recovered a fumble on a Jefferson City punt return.

"Defensively, I was really proud of our guys," Schneider said. "When you go against a running back like that, you can't miss tackles."

Washington (3-1 in the GAC North) plays its final league contest Friday at Warrenton (4-2, 4-1) at 7 p.m.

"Warrenton has a lot of skill players. They're scary with the amount of speed they have. They've been improving every year and this year they have a really good team," Schneider said. "It's going to be a battle on their Homecoming. All I can ask from our guys is to put forth their best effort and we'll see what happens after four quarters."

Blue Jays Top Warrenton in Double OT

Washington's final GAC North football game of the season was a memorable one.

Playing at Warrenton Friday night, the Blue Jays won a double overtime thriller, 35-34.

“It was a game our kids are going to remember for a long time,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “It was a great win. Our kids played hard all the way. There were a lot of exciting things.”

The score was tied 21-21 at the end of regulation.

Starting from the opposing 25-yard line, Warrenton got the ball first in the first overtime and scored on a one-yard touchdown run by quarterback Scott Lathrop to make the score 28-21.

Washington answered on a 16-yard run by Kyle Phipps for a touchdown. Sam Kosark’s extra point sent the game into double overtime.

The Blue Jays (4-3, 4-1) got the ball first in the second overtime. On fourth down and one, quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger hit Brandon Garrard for a 16-yard touchdown pass. Kosark’s kick gave the Blue Jays a 35-28 advantage, their first lead of the game.

“It was a play-action pass and nobody was within 15 yards of Brandon,” Schneider said.

The Warriors (4-3, 4-2) then answered on a 11-yard touchdown pass from Lathrop to Nick Todd.

Warrenton then called a timeout, and decided to go for two points and the win.

“Lathrop rolled out to his right for a run-pass option play,” Schneider explained. “Our defensive backs did a good job covering their receivers. Lathrop kept the ball and went for the end zone. Chase Hellebusch got to him first and did a great job wrapping him up and not allowing him to extend his arms. Clayton Hamai came in and got him to the ground. He was close to the goal line, but didn’t get in.”

After a meeting between the officials, it was ruled that Lathrop did not score.

“The referee was right there on top of the play,” Schneider said. “He made the call pretty quick. The officials met just to make sure they had the right call.”

A big moment in the game came early in the fourth quarter.

With Warrenton leading 21-14, Washington’s defense held the Warriors on a goal line stand, giving the Blue Jays the ball at their own one-yard line.

On the very next play, Hasenjaeger hit Adam Hawkinson for a 99-yard touchdown pass to tie the game 21-21 with 7:35 remaining in the fourth quarter.

“It was a play-action pass that sucked up their safeties and gave Adam one-on-one coverage with their defensive back,” Schneider said. “Our linemen did a great job pass blocking, Luke made a good throw and Adam made a great play to catch the ball and run it for a touchdown. It was an exciting way for us to tie the game.”

Warrenton took a 7-0 lead with 7:57 left in the first quarter on a three-yard touchdown pass from Lathrop to Cody Bennett.

Washington made the score 7-7 with 27 seconds remaining in the opening quarter on a 11-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to Brock Hopkins.

The Warriors regained the lead 14-7 on a 10-yard touchdown pass from T.J. Lafaver to Todd with 7:17 left in the second quarter.

The Blue Jays answered again with 5:34 to play in the second quarter on a three-yard touchdown run by Phipps to make the score 14-14.

A nine-yard touchdown run by Todd gave Warrenton a 21-14 advantage with 3:24 left in the second quarter.

Warrenton held a 21-14 lead at halftime.

Hasenjaeger was 20-38 passing for 342 yards and three touchdowns.

Phipps carried the ball 26 times for 162 yards and scored two touchdowns.

Hawkinson had five catches for 196 yards and one touchdown.

Lathrop was 13-29 passing for 210 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. He also rushed for 103 yards on 21 carries and scored one touchdown. Todd had seven catches for 115 yards and scored three touchdowns.

“They had opportunities to put the game away. We did things to prevent that from happening,” Schneider said. “It was a good win over a very good team. We have some momentum going into our district games.”

Washington opens Class 5 District 5 play Friday at home against Parkway West (1-6) at 7 p.m.

“Parkway West is a very athletic, disciplined team. They run a pro-style offense,” Schneider said. “Hopefully we can get off to a good start and get them down early in the game.”

It marks the return of former Blue Jays Head Coach Jeff Duncan, who now is the head coach at Parkway West.

“Jeff and I are still good friends. He gave me the opportunity to come here and coach,” Schneider said. “It’s going to be fun talking to him before the game. It’s not going to be as fun after the game because one of us is not going to be very happy. It will be nice to see him back here at Washington.”

When you put your blood, sweat and tears for the last 11 years into one place, it means a lot."

Parkway West(2-6)took a 7-0 lead on a 72-yard touchdown run by quarterback Dominique Atkins with 4:00 left in the first quarter.

Washington(4-4)tied the game 7-7 when quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger fired a 35-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Garrard with 1:45 left in the first quarter.

The Longhorns then scored 21 unanswered points.

Atkins tossed a 50-yard touchdown pass to Sean Roskamp with seven seconds left in the first quarter. Charles Thomas ran 66 yards for a score with 8:10 remaining in the second quarter. Atkins then tossed a 40-yard touchdown to Cole Lema with 5:45 left in the second quarter to make the score 28-7.

The Blue Jays answered with 2:05 left in the second quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by Kyle Phipps.

Parkway West led 28-14 at halftime.

"We had some assignment problems in the first half. We had some problems in coverage and with tackling. When you get down in a hole like that, it's tough to come back,"Schneider said."Jeff has a good line and good backs. They did a great job. He found a way to attack us and he kept attacking us."

Washington scored on its first drive of the third quarter, a 18-yard touchdown pass from Hasenjaeger to Mike McGilvray with 7:35 left in the third quarter.

The Longhorns, who threw just three passes all night, used their running game to run the time down. They put the game away with 42 seconds left in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard touchdown run by Thomas to increase their lead to 35-21.

Washington accumulated 327 total yards, 262 passing and 65 rushing.

Hasenjaeger was 18-39 passing for 262 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

Kyle Phipps carried the ball 26 times for 64 yards and one touchdown.

Adam Hawkinson(48 yards)and Sam Kosark(43 yards)both finished with four receptions.

McGilvray added three catches for 57 yards and one touchdown.

Garrard(47 yards), Marc Goebel(42 yards)and Phipps(19 yards)each added two catches.

"We moved the ball decently. We just have to take care of the ball and put it in the end zone,"Schneider said."We didn't do enough on offense as far as catching the ball. Our quarterback threw the ball up a little in bad situations. They got pressure on us, which was the first time anybody has gotten that kind of pressure on us. We had a fumble that led to a touchdown and an interception that led to a touchdown."

Parkway West totaled 397 yards, 292 rushing and 105 passing.

"We played a really good first half. Washington did a good job making some adjustments and we knew that was going to happen,"Duncan said."Our guys stuck with it. We talked about the offensive line winning the game. When we kept the chains moving, it was a great experience."

The Longhorns ran out the final several minutes of the game, capped by Thomas'touchdown with under a minute left to play.

"I told our kids that on this very field against Waynesville one year, we had the ball at the 1-yard line and went 99 yards running nothing but lead right and lead left,"Duncan said."And we were going to go that route to win this game."

It turned out to be an emotional win for Duncan.

"It was definitely different. I tried not to think about it all week. I didn't think it would get to me. But I got here, and it was like, wow,"Duncan said."The guys here were great. I talked to Matt and Zach for a long time. It's good seeing these kids. I can't say enough about what the coaching staff has done with the kids here and how they continue to build on a great program."

Schneider is glad the game with Parkway West is history, although the outcome was not what the Blue Jays wanted.

"Like I told Jeff before the game, I couldn't wait until this game was over. When you have two good friends like we are, it's hard,"Schneider said."This loss is going to be a tough one for us to handle. We have to get over it this week and get ready for the next one."

Kirkwood defeated Vianney in the other Class 5 District 5 game, 36-6.

Washington returns to action Friday at Kirkwood(4-3)at 7 p.m.

"Kirkwood is going to be riding high. They're having a great year and playing against some tough teams,"Schneider said."We just have to be prepared and ready to go. There's going to be a lot of speed on the field. We're going to have to figure out a way to combat that speed. We have to move the ball, take care of the ball and put it in the end zone."

The Blue Jays were eliminated from playoff consideration last Friday with a 41-12 loss at Kirkwood in a Class 5 District 5 contest.

Schneider said Vianney is a much better team than its 1-8 record shows.

“They haven’t had a lot of success this year, but a lot of that is attributed to who they play. They’ve played teams in Class 6 that will be in the thick of things in the postseason,” Schneider said. “They’ll be ready to play us. They’ve had success against us in the past. Their offense is geared more toward running the ball. They have two really good running backs. One is a senior and the other is a freshman. Their quarterback got knocked out of the game against Kirkwood and they brought in another kid who probably rushed for 200 yards in the first half against Parkway West. We’re going to have to be able to tackle. If we miss tackles, they’ll take it all the way.”

Vianney’s lone win came in week two over Northwest, 44-14. Some of its losses have come against Chaminade, DeSmet, SLUH, CBC and Kirkwood.

WHS-Kirkwood

Washington had its hands full in its 41-12 loss to Kirkwood.

“Kirkwood is a really good team. They have a lot of talent and a lot of speed,” Schneider said. “I wouldn’t want to go against them in the playoffs. They’re going to be a force.”

Leading 7-0 after one quarter, the Pioneers broke the game open with leads of 27-0 at halftime and 41-0 after three quarters.

“Defensively, we started the game pretty well. Offensively, we struggled to start the game,” Schneider said. “We returned the opening kickoff into their territory and couldn’t do anything with it. Our defense then got a turnover on their second drive and we couldn’t do anything with it. We didn’t take advantage of our opportunities early in the game.”

Washington got on the scoreboard with a pair of fourth quarter scores.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger tossed touchdown passes of 19 yards to Sam Kosark and 52 yards to Max Phinney.

For the game, Hasenjaeger was 16-28 passing for 159 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.

Kyle Phipps carried the ball 16 times for 103 yards. Randall Flotte rushed for four yards on four attempts.

“Kyle ran the ball hard in the second half. He had two big runs where he was bouncing off people,” Schneider said. “Our offensive line did a good job in the second half. Kirkwood’s strength and speed was imposing to some of our guys up front in the first half. Once we settled in, we did a better job in the second half. We moved the ball.”

Kosark finished with six receptions for 57 yards and one touchdown. Mike McGilvray (18 yards) and Brock Hopkins (five) both had two catches.

Marc Goebel, Adam Hawkinson, Luke Hoemann, Robert Luck, Kyle Summers and Phinney each added one catch.

Washington made some plays defensively.

“We did some good things defensively for the first quarter-and-a-half. We played man-to-man coverage and didn’t get beat over the top. We blitzed to stop the run,” Schneider said. “Part of the problem was we didn’t keep the ball offensively long enough, which helped them figure out what we were doing defensively.”

Kirkwood quarterback Sam Yarborough was 14-19 passing for 171 yards and two touchdowns.

“Their sophomore quarterback is unbelievable. We knew we would have to put pressure on him to have a chance,” Schneider said. “We were successful doing that for a quarter-and-a-half, but they figured out where to put their athletes in space against our defense and it snowballed from there. Our offense couldn’t stay on the field. They figured out where to attack us defensively.”

Schneider said playing a team like Kirkwood will help the program.

“It was a learning experience and a good game for our kids to play,” Schneider said. “We’ll be a better team in the long run. Hopefully our kids will figure out what it takes to play and be successful against teams like Kirkwood.”

Vianney Beats Blue Jays In Season Finale

A slow start to the game was too much for Washington to overcome last Friday at Vianney High School.

The Blue Jays (4-6, 0-3) ended their football season with a 30-14 loss to Vianney in a Class 5 District 5 contest.

“Not being able to find the right buttons to push this year was frustrating. We didn’t put things together consistently,” said Washington Head Coach Zach Schneider. “We did some good things, but we didn’t put it all together.”

It was the final game of the season for both Washington and Vianney.

Kirkwood defeated Parkway West 35-0 last Friday to win the district title. Both teams have advanced to the Class 5 playoffs.

The Blue Jays fell behind 27-0 by the early stages of the second quarter against Vianney.

“We put our defense in bad situations early in the game,” Schneider said. “Our offense couldn’t stay on the field in the first quarter.”

Vianney’s first-quarter scores came on a 17-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ryan Snyder to Mark Smith and a six-yard touchdown pass from Snyder to Matt Guignon.

The Griffins (2-8, 1-3) increased their lead to 21-0 early in the second quarter when Snyder tossed a 25-yard touchdown pass to Markel Smith.

Vianney’s Joe Stevens then returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown to make the score 27-0.

An interception by Adam Gildehaus helped the Blue Jays get on the scoreboard.

Quarterback Luke Hasenjaeger ran 14 yards for a touchdown with 1:29 left in the second quarter to make the score 27-7.

Vianney took the 27-7 advantage into halftime.

Another turnover helped set up Washington’s second touchdown. Joe Collins recovered a fumble, which turned into a 72-yard scoring drive.

The Blue Jays scored when Hasenjaeger tossed a 25-yard touchdown pass to Brock Hopkins on the final play of the third quarter to make the score 27-14.

Vianney added a 25-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring.

“We started completing some passes and getting into a rhythm in the second half,” Schneider said.

Hasenjaeger was 20-45 passing for 223 yards with one touchdown and four interceptions. He rushed for 12 yards on four attempts and scored one touchdown.

Kyle Phipps carried the ball 10 times for 38 yards and had three catches for 31 yards.

Mike McGilvray finished the game with four receptions for 81 yards.

Hopkins had five catches for 59 yards and one touchdown.

Marc Goebel added three receptions for 34 yards. Adam Hawkinson had two catches for five yards. Brandon Garrard (six yards), Sam Kosark (four yards) and Kyle Summers (three yards) each had one reception.

Derek Walters and Gildehaus both had an interception for Washington. Collins recovered a fumble.

Kosark converted both of his extra-point attempts.

“Defensively, I was not disappointed with how we played. We just got put in some bad situations,” Schneider said. “They made two big throws where we were in position to make plays, but didn’t.”

Vianney’s Snyder was 18-30 passing for 255 yards with three touchdowns and one interception.

Kadarius Green carried the ball 26 times for 106 yards and added seven receptions for 161 yards.

“I thought we had a good team this year. We just didn’t show our true colors in the last three games,” Schneider said. “Heading into our district games 4-3 and coming off a big win over Warrenton, I felt pretty good about where we were. After the loss to Parkway West, I think some of the kids lost confidence in themselves.”

Washington had some talented younger players on the team this season who will need to continue to develop their football skills.

“We have a good group of kids who got some varsity experience and will be back with us next year,” Schneider said. “We’re never going to be the biggest team. We have to get faster to be able to compete with teams on this level. Hopefully these last three games will motivate our kids. They have to prepare themselves for being able to play on this level.”

Schneider appreciates what the seniors did for the program.

“I’m going to miss our seniors. I’ve been here four years with them. They kind of grew up in front of me,” Schneider said. “They’re a fun group to be around. I’m going to miss our practices with them. They’re a great group of kids who I really enjoyed coaching.”
